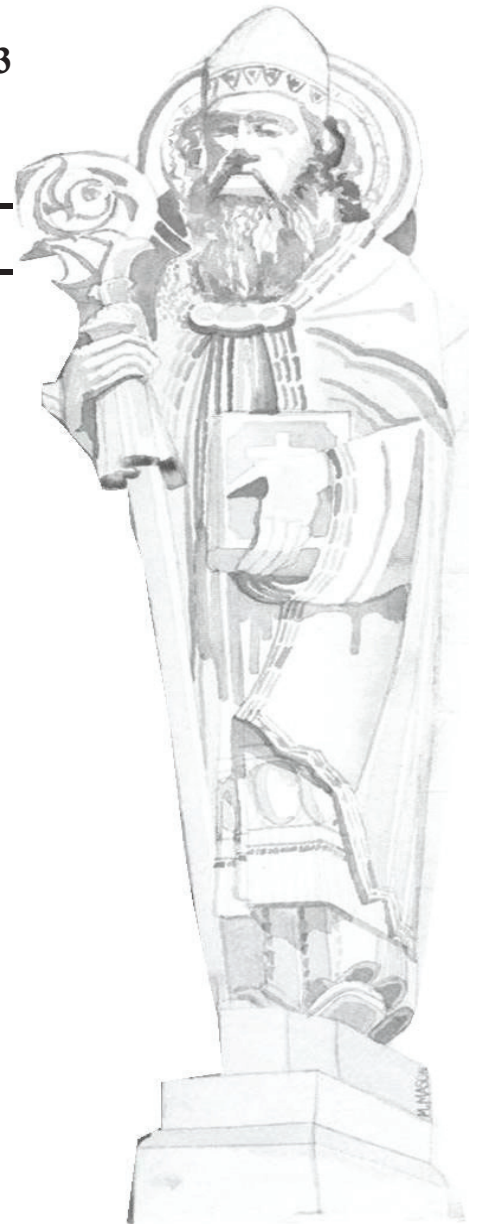

**THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY
THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD**

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God - God whom chose to take our human flesh, born of Mary. It is very easy to look at a baby with love, wanting what is good for them with all our hearts. This gives us some idea of how God looks at us. The first reading tells us: *The Lord bless you and keep you! The Lord let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! God looks on us with love, as his sons and daughters. His face shines upon us. The second reading is taken from Paul. He writes: As proof that you are sons, God sent His Spirit into our hearts, crying out "Abba Father!" we call out to God the Father, trusting that, similar to the way a human parent looks adoringly at a newborn child, God looks on us. As we begin to accept how God looks on us with love, it naturally leads us to look to others with love. We begin to see in others that they are children of God. Today is a traditional day to pray for peace. Might not peace be ours if we could see each other as God sees us, sons and daughters of God, and brothers and sisters to one another?*

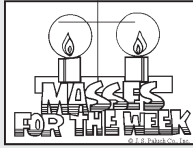


ST. COLMAN MONTHLY FISH FRY JANUARY 6th 3-7PM IN THE SCHOOL CAFETERIA
