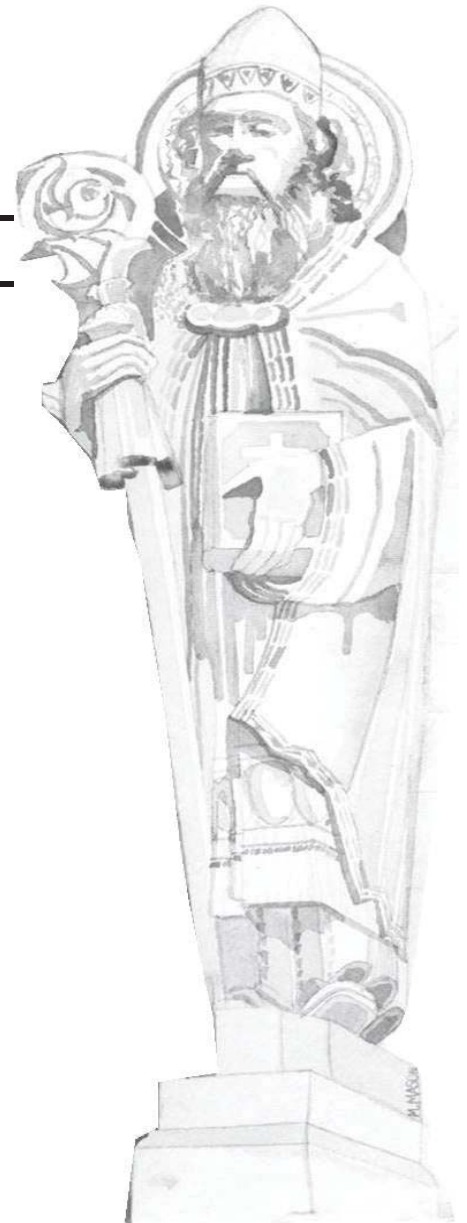

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Baptism is called the gate of the sacraments or the entrance way to the church itself. All the promises of salvation, coming from various biblical sources, become real in baptism. As the baptism of Jesus is recounted, his experience points to our own baptism as well. The Father acknowledges Jesus as Son and favored one upon whom God's Spirit rests. We are also blessed as his favored daughters and sons through the sacrament. The gift of new life, a share in the divine, is given to us in a special way. But there is a responsibility on the part of each of us to nourish that gift and allow it to grow. It is fitting that we finish the Christmas Season with this feast. As we reflect upon the gift of God's Son to the world, the message and example of the life of the Son are placed before us to teach us how to respond to our baptismal call. We must reflect his message and life in the activities of daily life.
