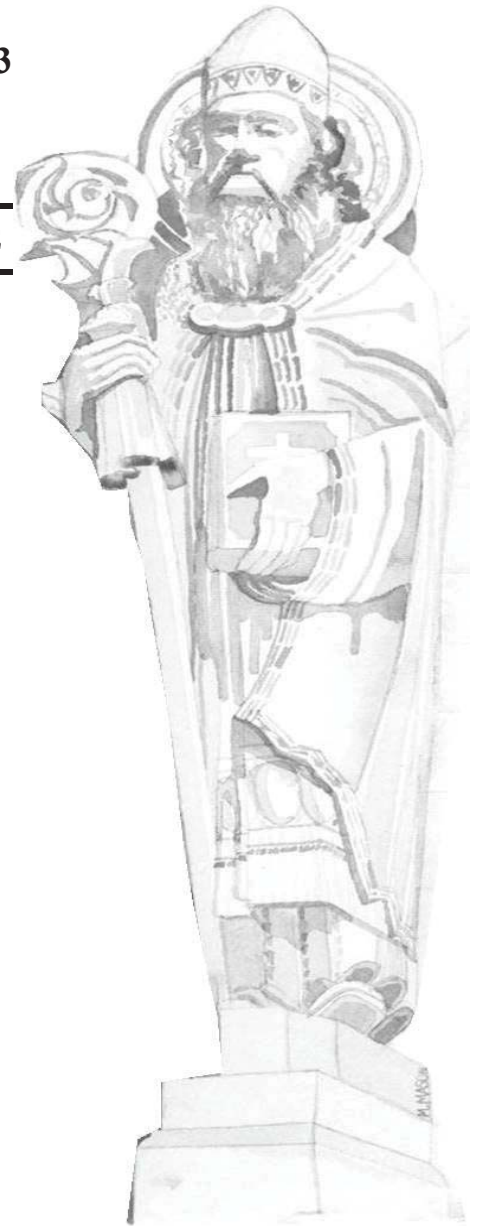

SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Today's liturgy of the Word couples John the Baptist's recognition of Jesus and his mission with Isaiah's second song of the suffering servant. What is said of the mission of Jesus is to be duplicated in the life of every Christian. As Paul indicated, the Christian is "consecrated" and "called" just as was Jesus himself. This calling results in our forgiveness and is also the source of our mission. It is easy to forget that our calling carries with it a real sense of responsibility. Our call signifies a sacredness before the Lord. It implies the fact that we have been forgiven. But just as Paul identifies himself as an apostle, one who is sent, the same is true of us, sent to the neighborhood, the workplace, the town or city, the school. We are called to bring a deep commitment to Christian values to a society of shifting values, this commission springs from Baptism and is reinforced by Confirmation. It is a call that touches all of us. Our words and actions should reflect the message of Christ to contribute to the work of the Church.

**CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK**

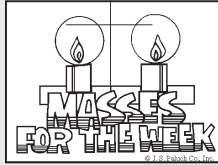
