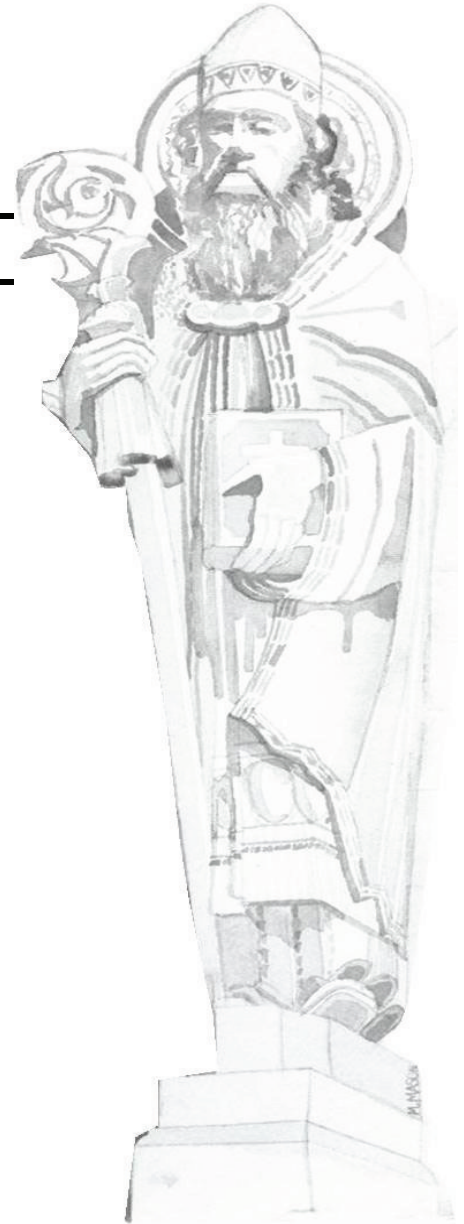

PRO LIFE DAY - OVERTURN ROE VS WADE

Many people will be traveling to Washington, D.C. in protest of our present laws legalizing abortion. It is a tragedy as we know. Going to D.C. is an excellent thing to do to show our government that we the people do not agree with this law and how it is hurting us. However, not everyone can make that trip. Therefore, St. Bernadette Parish is going to use Monday, January 23rd for additional prayers and Masses for an end to abortion. The schedule will be: 5:30am - Mass for an end to abortion (for those going on the March for Life, but all are welcome). 8:50am - regularly scheduled Morning Prayer and Rosary. 9:30am - regularly scheduled Mass. 11:00am - Adoration with all four rosaries and the Divine Mercy chaplet followed by Mass for an end to abortion. It is hard to say exactly what time Mass will be over since we will be praying four rosaries and the Divine Mercy chaplet, but an estimate would be 12:30pm. The evening will begin at 5:30pm instead of the normal 6:00pm. Again from 5:30-7:00pm we will pray all four rosaries and the Divine Mercy Chaplet for an end to abortion. There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until Mass begins at 7:00pm. 7:00pm - Regularly scheduled Mass. 7:30pm - Regularly scheduled Adoration and confessions.
