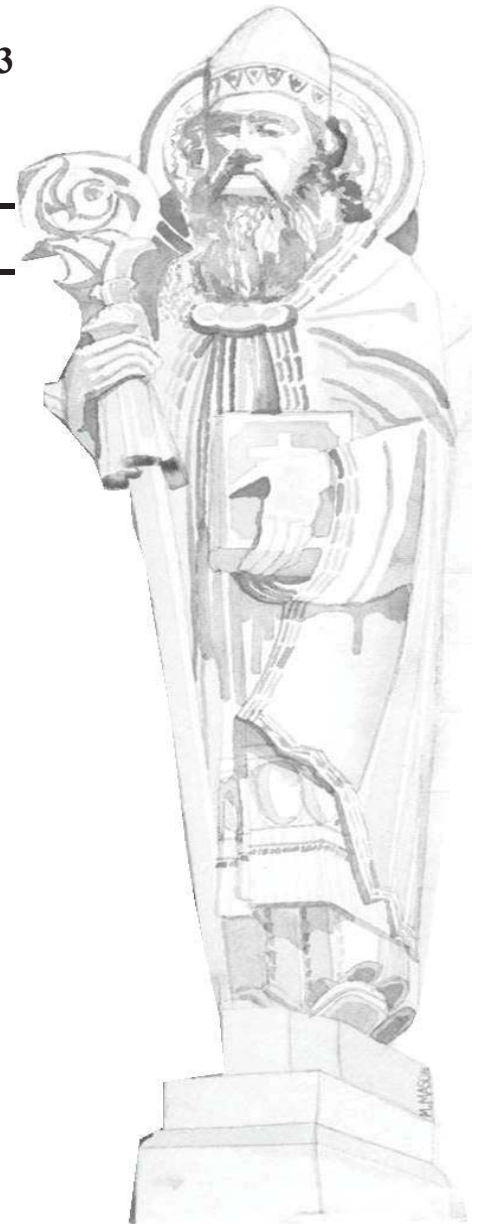

Monroeville Knights of Columbus presents "Knight at the Races", Friday, January 27th at St. Bernadette Parish Lourdes Center.

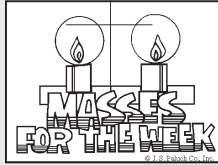
