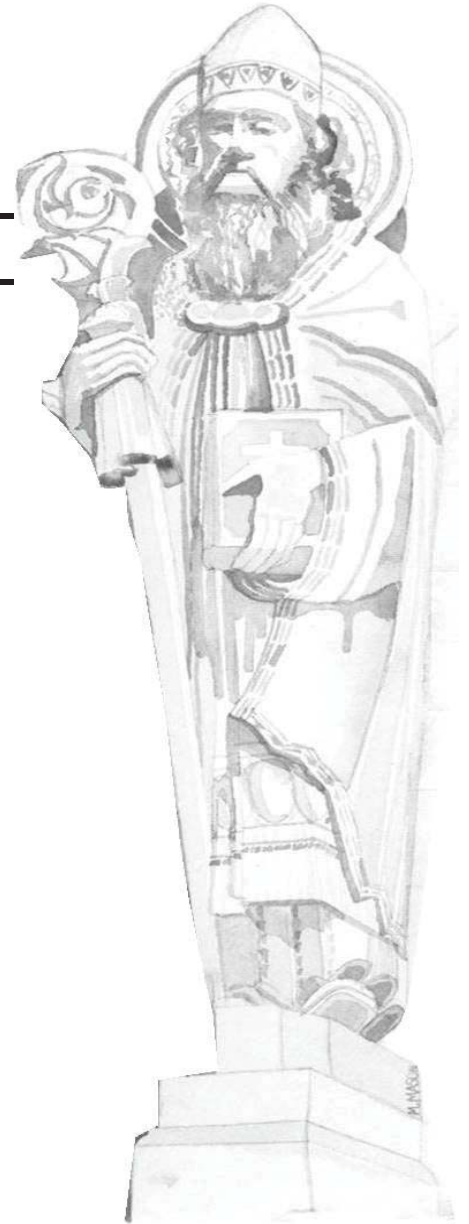

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The public ministry of Jesus begins with a call to conversion. Christianity today in large measure has failed to grasp the significance of this call. It is more than a single act or moment in life when one moves from non-belief to acceptance of the faith; it is a lifelong process. Discipleship is a call to growth. That is why "being in Christ" has such a dynamic sense in the New Testament. Our life in Christ needs regular assessment, periods of reflection and prayer, days of recollection. And a real measure of our growth the love and service we reflect as expressions of the presence of God in our lives each day.

A Family Perspective
