

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Brothers and Sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. Sunday, February 3rd, is the Memorial of St. Blaise. The opportunity to receive this blessing will be offered after the weekend Masses. Remain after the closing hymn if you wish to receive the blessing.
