

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The Beatitudes in the Sermon on the Mount are not written in the form of commands. Rather, they

are charter-statements. Jesus does not specifically command us, "Be merciful!" or "Be a peacemaker!" He tells us what will happen if we are. The Beatitudes express ideal conclusions for courageous behavior. The statement on mercifulness is an excellent example. It is also one of the most difficult to carry out. The root meaning of mercy is to give compassionate attention to others, even when they have done nothing to deserve it. It means withholding vengeance against those who have unjustly provoked us. It means a willingness to suffer with them and support them as they struggle to return to the path of goodness. Even Jesus had compassion for the people who executed him. Many have said that the teachings of Jesus are too difficult to put into practice. But Christians must not give into the temptation that the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount are optional. They are the heart of the Christian message. If we aren't receiving from others the compassionate understanding and mercy we desire, perhaps we are neglecting the first part of this difficult charter-statement.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: "In our humility we are blessed when we are meek, merciful, clean of heart and peacemakers. It is in those times that we can, 'rejoice and be glad, for our reward will be great in heaven." Deacon Herb Follow Deacon Herb on Facebook.

BLESSING OF THE THROATS

St. Blaise was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. According to various accounts he was a physican before becoming a bishop. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. In the United States the annual blessing of the throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. This blessing is given on Friday, February 3rd, the memorial of St. Blaise. The opportunity to receive this blessing will be offered at the following times on Friday, February 3rd: following the 8:30am Mass and 6:45pm.
