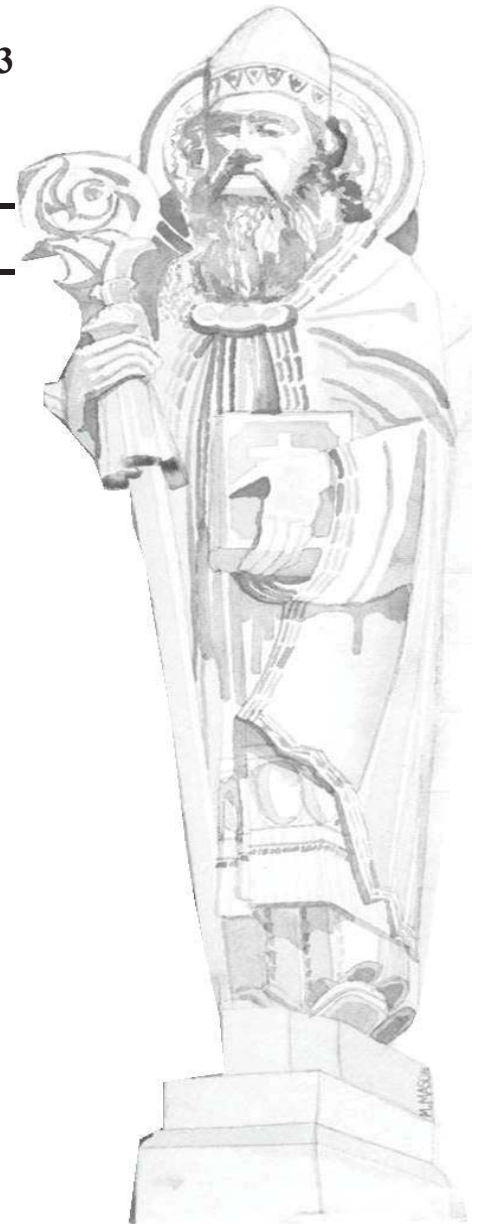

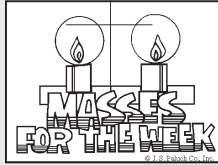
PRE CANA MARRIAGE PREPARATION CLASS

DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR BAPTISM? From its earliest days, the Church has seen Lent as a time to remember our baptism. On that day each of us became a member of the **Body of Christ**. St. Paul reminds us that in baptism we share a common bond with all other Christians. In 1 Corinthians 12:12-13, 25 he writes, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit...There should be no division in the body but. . . Its parts should have equal concern for each other."The 40 days of Lent are a time to **remember our baptism** and to consider the meaning of our lives and how together we can better follow Jesus as members of His body. This Lent, as we continue to journey *On Mission for the Church Alive!* All Catholics are invited to **"Back to the Font,"** a Morning of Reflection that includes presentation, prayer and discussion.
