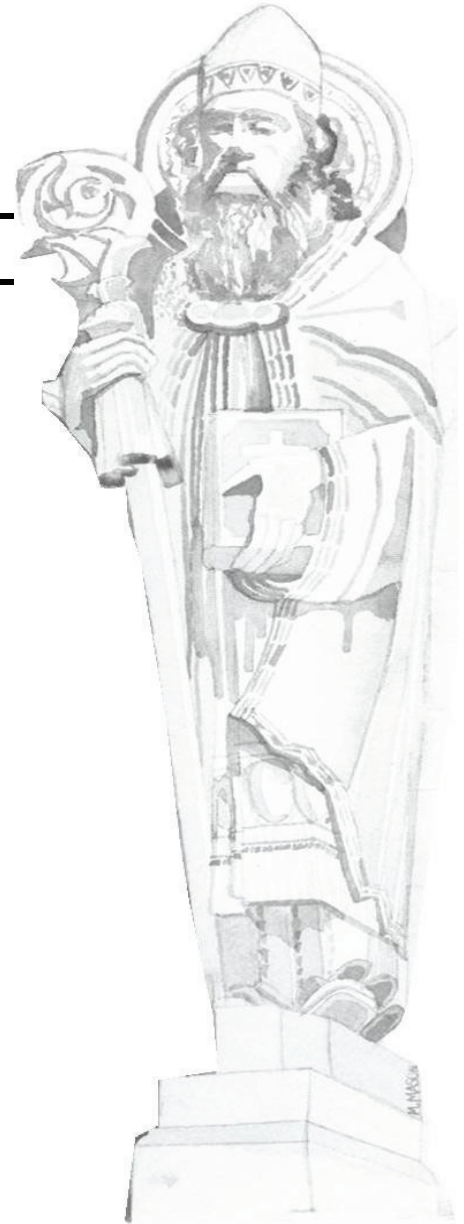

THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The leper in the gospel today did not ask Jesus for a cure. Note that there is no petition in his words to Christ: "If you wish, you can make me clean." The leper approached Jesus with an acclamation of his own dependence on Christ, an all-inclusive power of Jesus, an affirmation of his own dependence on Christ, an act of faith in Jesus' divine capacities. His prayer was perfect. It was God-centered. The leper left himself totally open to the divine. What a different approach from demanding God to do it our way. The prayer of the leper is open and humble. He states his faith in the healing power of Jesus and allows Jesus to take it from there. He gives no ultimatums nor does he suggest possible disappointment nor does he attempt to "strike a deal" with Jesus. Let us remember the lesson of the leper in our prayer life.
