

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

All three readings today have us ponder the same thing: holiness. Be holy, for I the Lord your God,

am holy (Leviticus). The Temple of God, which you are, is holy (1 Cotinhians). So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect (Matthew). We are called to holiness. Ultimately, being holy means conforming our lives to God whom is holy. Being holy is about a relationship, not about goodness alone. When we think about holiness we often think of individuals such as the saints. The concept of scriptural holiness, however, is bigger than being a saint. Not only is an individual called to holiness, the entire community is called to holiness. To be holy we must have a foot in each camp: we must concern ourselves not only with our individual relationship with God, but also with our relationship with the believers and that community's relationship with God. Holiness is found in following the purpose of Jesus' life: preaching, death and resurrection. All was done to reunite us with the Father. We might ponder how we can achieve this holiness and how we can be better conformed to the person of Christ and being people together around God's table of peace.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: "God is the pure and perfect example of love. While our love can never be as perfect as His, we can be His temple when we love as best we can with all of our own imperfections." Deacon Herb Follow Deacon Herb on Facebook.
