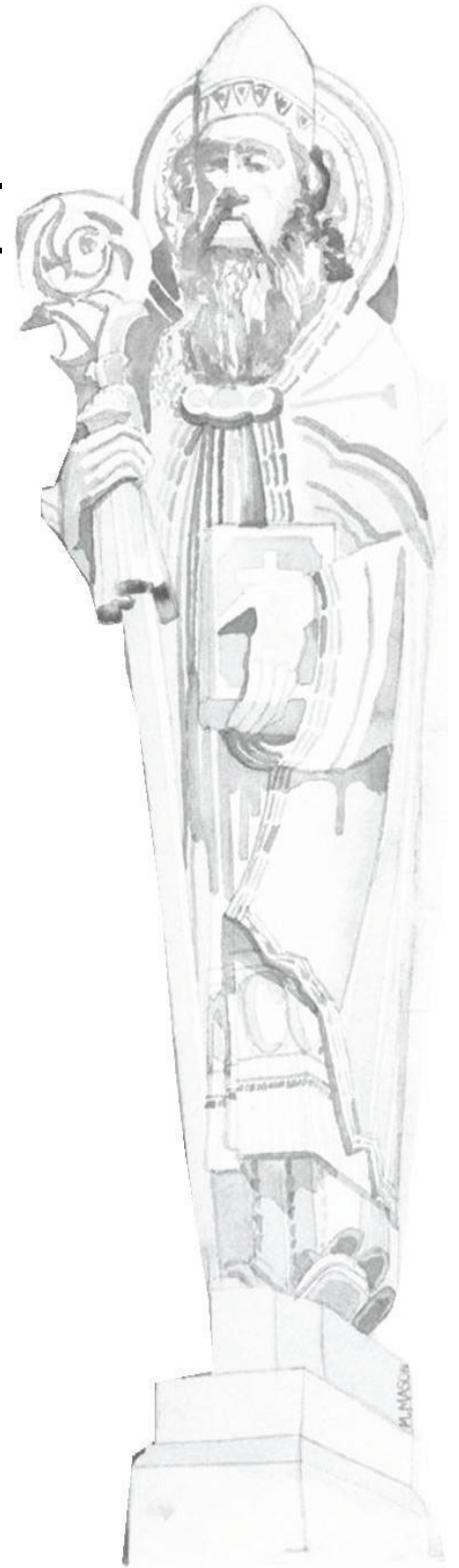

NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



“Anyone who hears my words and puts them into practice is like the wise person who built a house on rock.” The teachings of Jesus treat of those who speak the words of faith but fail to act upon them. In fact, Jesus’ teaching on faith without works emerges clearly in today’s liturgy. It is not enough to say “I believe” or “I pray” or “I am involved in ministry.” faith goes a lot deeper. Faith does the worthwhile things mentioned above. But it also loves enemies, seeks forgiveness, cares for disabled persons, is concerned with the homeless. True believers examine their conscience with the Sermon on the Mount as the basis. Today’s scripture reminds us that it is not meant to be an easy life. It is a question of bringing Christ to the struggles of humanity. That is the cost of discipleship.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. the law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-59. no one should consider this obligation lightly.
3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obligated to fast, but should perform some other act of penance suitable to their age.
4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
5. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by the law.
6. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance of social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions, or funeral wakes are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.

DIOCESAN DATABASE & REGULATIONS FOR ALL MINISTRIES: All ministers including catechists, staff, choir, ushers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, etc. are required by the Diocese of Pittsburgh to be cleared in the following ways: 1) Be registered on the Diocesan Database. 2) Sign the Code of Pastoral Conduct. 3) Be cleared by the Dept. of Public Welfare for Child Abuse. 4) Be cleared by the State Police Criminal Record Check. 5) Attend Protecting God’s Children for Adults Workshop. THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The 14 Stations of the Cross can be found in almost every Catholic church and chapel, probably because throughout our history, Christians have longed to literally walk in the footsteps of Christ. For nearly 2,000 years the shines in and around Jerusalem have drawn pilgrims inspired by the life and death of the Lord. However, not everyone is able to travel to the Holy Land, so ever since the Middle Ages, churches began erecting images devoted to various aspects of the passion. By the 15th century, the Franciscans had developed a devotion they called “stations,” which means a place where people stand still or gather together. It took a while to fix the number and the names of the stations, but in 1731 Pope Clement XII established the 14 we know today. Even now there are variations on the number. Some versions (like the one we use here) add a 15th station, the Resurrection of Christ, because the death of Christ means nothing without the Resurrection. Another example is the version designed by Pope John Paul II, which eliminates some stations which were based solely on tradition (the three falls, Veronica, etc.) and replaces them with events from gospels (the betrayal by Judas, the denial by Peter, etc.) Because the Stations of the Cross are an important Lenten devotion, we offer them here each Friday at 7pm.

CAPUCHIN FRANCISCAN FRIARS: For 800 years followers of St. Francis of Assisi have been rebuilding the Church. The Capuchin Franciscans are priests and brother who serve Christ in the spirit of St. Francis. Men between the ages of 16 – 40 are invited to visit a Capuchin friary.
