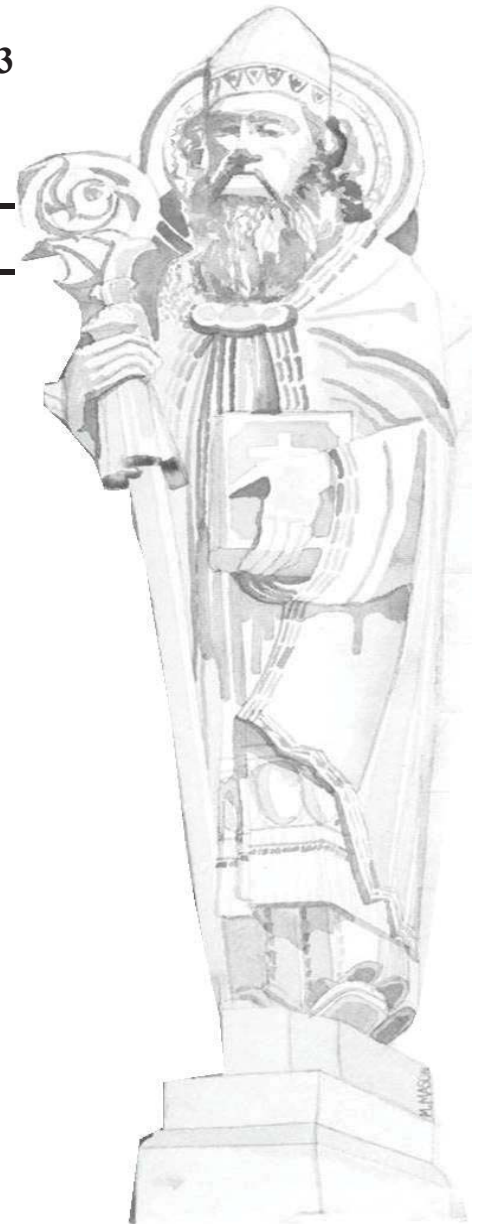

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

One of memorable quotations from scripture appears in today's reading from I Samuel. Humans see appearances but God looks at the heart. Externals entrap us so often. We are carried high by our heroes in life and so often dashed to the ground when we discover that they have feet of clay. We are taken up, even within the church, with titles and honors as measures of worth. But it is not the "little people" that inspire us the most. The elderly person who, whatever the weather, attends mass each day. There is the person for whom menial work is a sacred task. The bedridden invalid whose acceptance reveals an incredible faith. There are people who have little to give but do so and in receiving have a grateful smile. God sees more in the simple unsung people of our daily life than human criteria would ever admit. 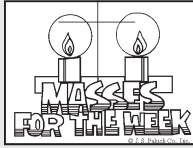
EUCHARISTIC ADORATION
