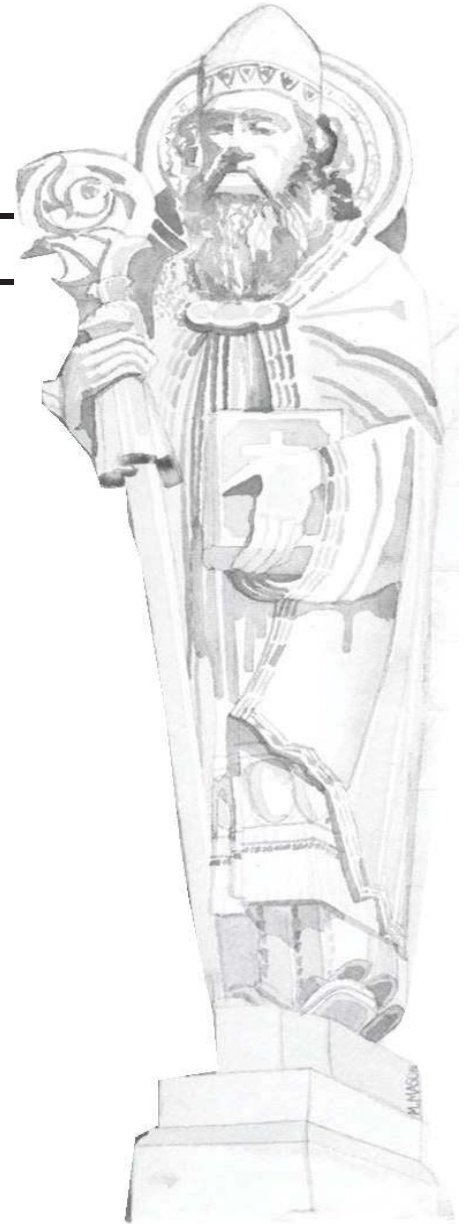

**FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT**

Today is Laetare Sunday, as the Entrance Antiphon indicates: "Rejoice, Jerusalem! Be glad for her, you who love her; rejoice with her, you who mourned for her, and you will find contentment..." Jerusalem, the home of God's people! Rejoice, because your children are on their way home, home to a true and better understanding of the part that God's enduring love and forgiveness plays in their lives. It is a Sunday of rejoicing because it recalls to us that we are God's work of art, created by his grace, not by our personal efforts. Let our tongues be silenced if we ever forget that God so loved the world and each and every one of us - - sinners and saints alike - - so much that he gave up his only Son, that all who believe in him might have eternal life.
