

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

When we are looking for wisdom where do we go? Often its seems that there are no real an-

swers to our difficulties. As people who have publicly stated that we are followers of Jesus, we find the wisdom we need in the cross of Jesus Christ. It is easy to avoid this cross through pleasures, addictions or sin. We often have trouble facing our own limitations - - - selfishness, brokenness, sinfulness. We can become blind and make excuses for shortcomings. But this does not bring us peace. The wisdom of the cross calls for seeking truth even when it means we have to go through the suffering of what that journey might mean. It is no small thing to face our darkness, to see ourselves as we really are, and not only as we want others to see us. Jesus on the cross has a wisdom to offer us what can be found in no other place. It is thee wisdom that is true and lasting. Living message of love and goodness can only result in our successful dealing with the struggles of life. Jesus walks with us through the difficult times. And we remember the Easter Mystery: suffering, sacrifice and denial led to Resurrection.

The Practice of Cremation and the Church Recently the Vatican reaffirmed its teaching on cremation:

Church law now permits the practice of cremation for our deceased faithful. However, this <u>permission</u> is given as an exception rather than as a general rule. The preferred form of final disposition of the deceased in the Catholic Church continues to be the burial of the body. In our diocese, when a family decides on cremation, <u>permission must be granted through the parish priest.</u> In addition, and of significant importance, is the fact that when a cremation of a Catholic person is arranged, <u>the remains must be given a proper burial in either a cemetery plot or a columbarium in a cemetery.</u> Proper respect of the remains <u>does not include any other disposition of the remains of the faithful.</u> We ask that you share this information with family members, friends, or neighbors who do not attend church regularly.


