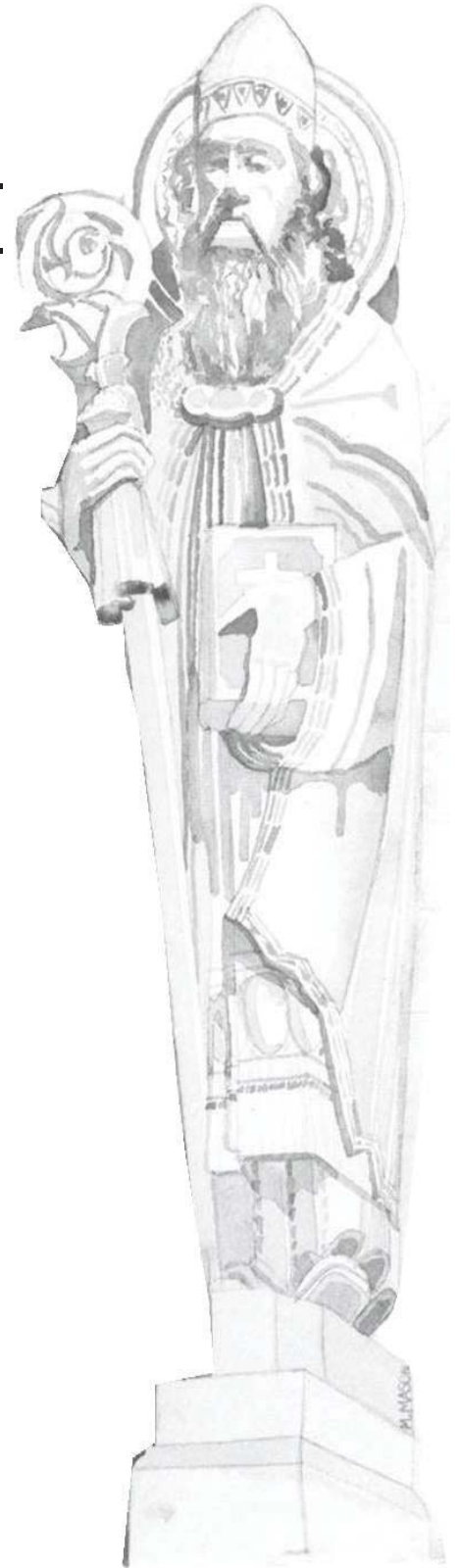

## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

There are few things in life that mean as much to us as trust. We all want to find people we can trust. We also want a God we can trust, because as important as our material and physical needs are, even more important are those needs we call our spiritual needs. When life itself threatens to overwhelm us, we need the comfort and assurance that can only come from a God who has our best interests at heart. We need to trust in God who knows us down to the last hair on our head, and who wants nothing, absolutely nothing, but the best for us. When everything around us seems to be falling apart, the challenge that faith puts before us is to trust that God will be there for us. For Jesus the Transfiguration (Gospel today) was a moment of trust in the will of his Father. That is the trust we must pray for also.

### LITURGICAL CAPSULES THAT AREN'T HARD TO SWALLOW

During the Lenten Season it is a good opportunity to reflect on the basic considerations in the Celebration of the Eucharist. Our attention will be focused on our reverence in church. **Silence is not only Golden but Sacred...** Worship is the reverence and honor we offer God for being who he is and for what he has done for us. When we worship God, we use words, actions and gestures to express our love and devotion. This is especially true when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist which is our greatest act of public worship. Our reverence and behavior should reflect the importance of each celebration. In order to set a prayerful atmosphere, our silent preparation is essential. Quiet time is important to allow each individual to mentally prepare for the celebration. Therefore, it is our responsibility to maintain respectful silence once we enter the doors of the church. Complete cooperation is required. If important conversation is necessary, individuals should move outside the main body of the church to the entrance area. Let us attempt to observe this practice for our celebration here at St. Colman. Stay tuned for more good news about expressing reverence.

### WHAT IS A PERMANENT DEACON?

#### QUESTIONS & ANSWERS , by Herb Riley

As our Ordination day draws near (less than 3 months away), I am being asked more and more questions about the diaconate. So Father Jim and I discussed my writing a series of Q & A articles for the bulletin between now and June 11th to try to answer those questions. So I will begin this first article answering the question, "What is a permanent deacon"? A permanent deacon is an ordained member of the clergy, with the primary ministry of service to the Church and all of its people. That service includes the ministry of Word, Sacrament and charity. Those ministries are carried out at various levels; the parish, the diocese, the vicariates, and at institutions such as hospitals, assisted living facilities, prisons, and shelters, just to name a few. Our class of deacons will be assigned to a parish for our Sunday liturgical work of Mass, the Word and Sacraments. We may also be assigned to the diocese, a vicariate or an institution as well. It all depends on how Bishop Zubik believes each of us can be best used to serve the Church.

**INFORMATION FOR THOSE WITH GLUTEN INTOLERANCE**

In recent years, pastors across the United States have received numerous questions from those afflicted with various manifestations of gluten intolerance, such as Celiac-Sprue disease, in relation to the reception of Holy Communion. Many gluten intolerant sufferers are unable to ingest wheat flour commonly used in the preparation of communion wafers. Those individuals may each react differently to varying amounts of gluten contained in wheat bread. Many doctors advise patients to restrict gluten intake. Low-gluten hosts are available. The Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Clyde, Missouri, have developed a true low gluten host which is approved for use at Mass. We have obtained a supply of these hosts. We would ask that anyone who has this unique situation, please contact the rectory. We can arrange to have the host available at the Mass you attend. You have to notify the celebrant prior to Mass in order that he is prepared.
