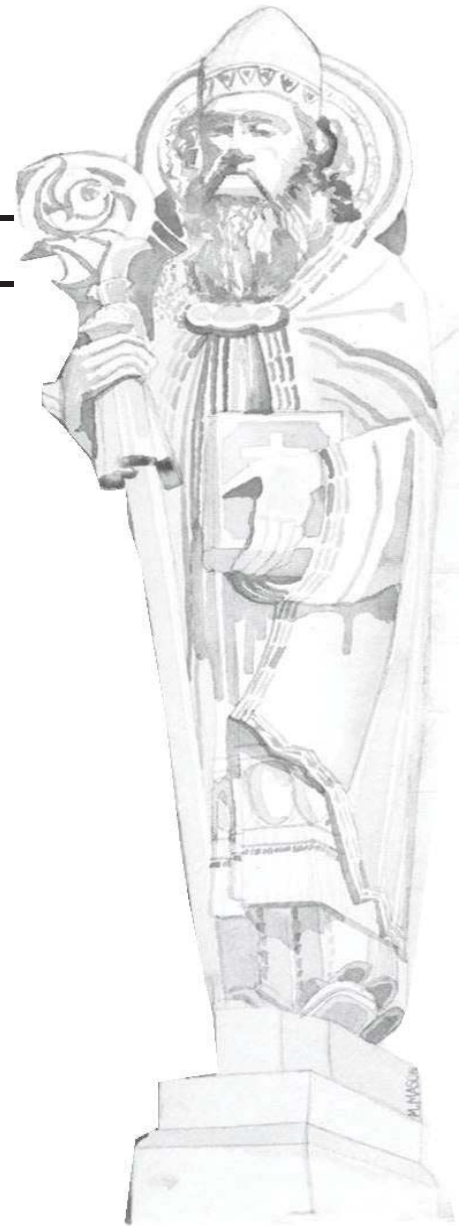

**THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT**

The successful outcome of God's salvific plan appears in all three readings today. In the midst of exile and dispersion, Jeremiah sows the seeds of hope with God's promise of a new and more effective covenant. The authors of the letter to the Hebrews and the gospel see the outcome of Jesus' work in his deliverance or glorification. But both of them state forcefully that this is realized only by Christ's following the path of suffering and endurance. The outcome is certain but it comes at a great price. As Jesus reminds us, discipleship means walking our own distinct path of glory. It involves a loss of life if life is to be gained. No two people walk the same path. For some people the loss of life is literal; they are called to martyrdom for the gospel. Others make sacrifices in the ordinary activities and encounters of daily life which challenge us to respond in a Christian manner. There are many paths to glory. But on that path the seed must die, for only death brings life.
