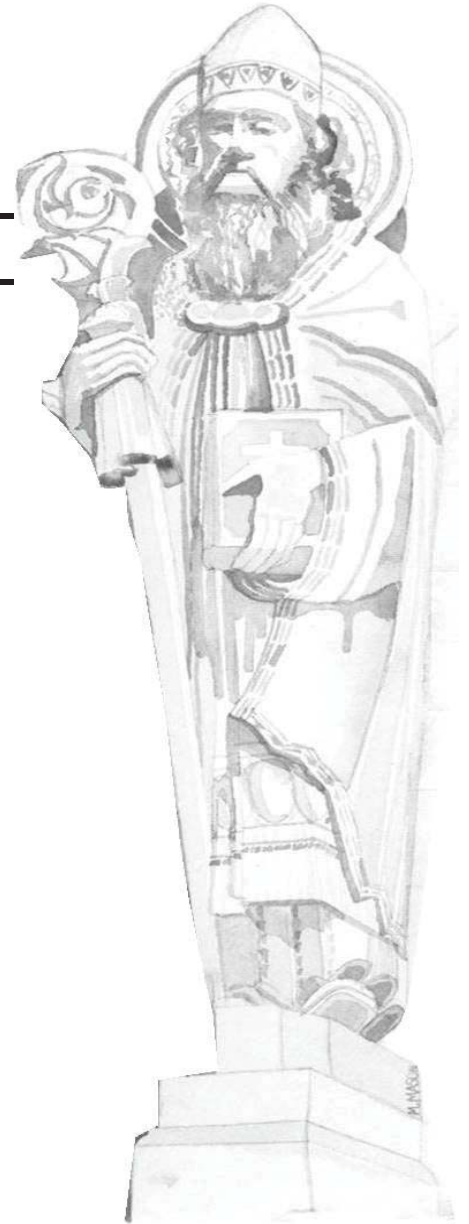

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The most memorable quotations from scripture appears in today's reading from I Samuel. Humans see appearances but God looks at the heart. Externals entrap us so often.
