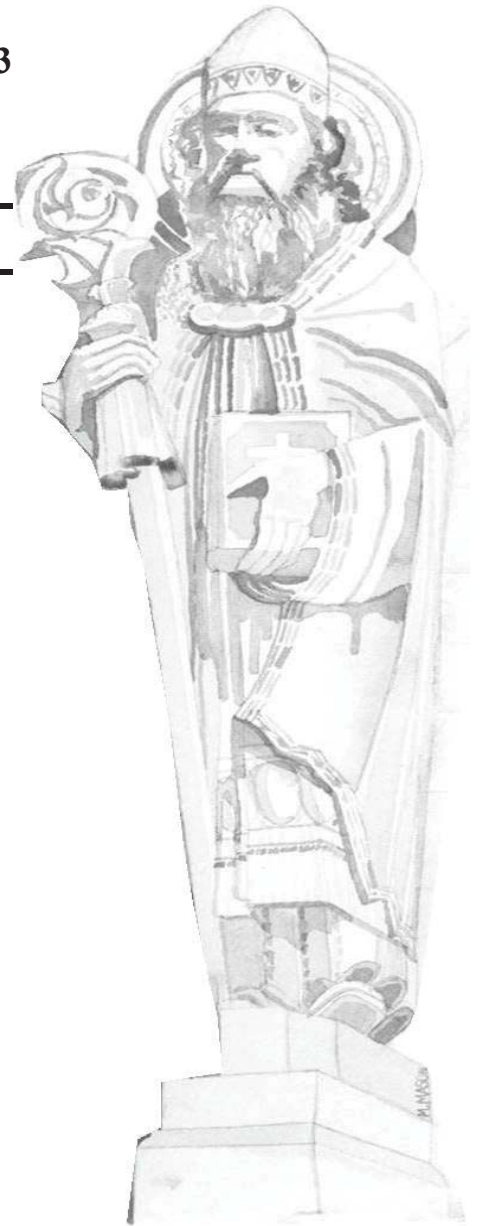

BAPTISM CLASS AND DATES OF CELEBRATION



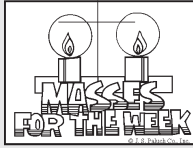
