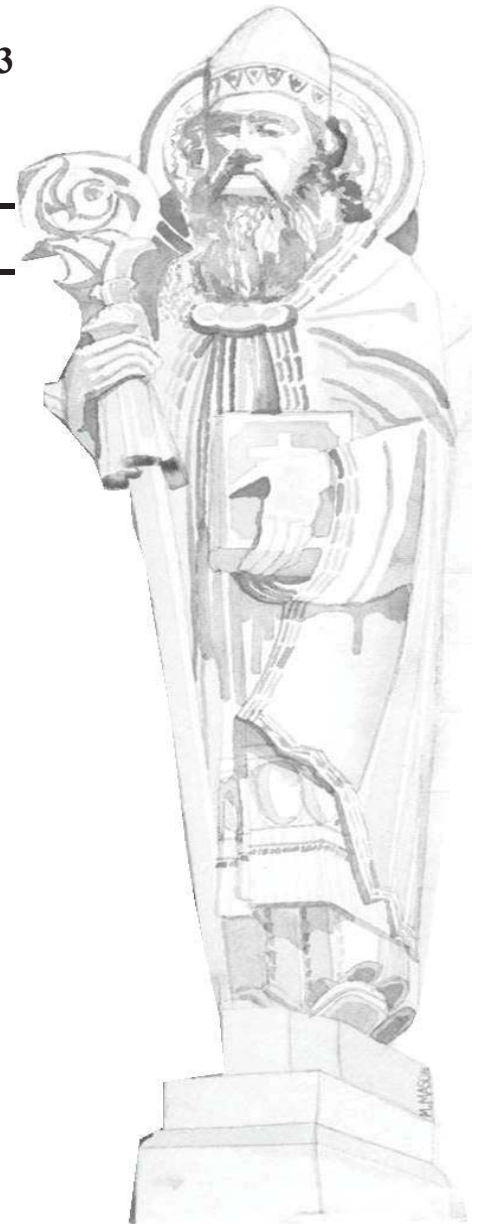

Liturgical Capsules that are Not Hard to Swallow

Reverence in Our Celebration of the Eucharist

Being on Time - Our time of arrival for Mass and when we leave Mass is an expression of our reverence. If Mass has simply become a routine or an obligation to be fulfilled, we will give it only a minimum amount of time. If we truly have a reverence and a respect for the Eucharist and are truly grateful to God, we would arrive on time, perhaps even a little early, and would remain there until Mass has ended. Arriving just in time for the readings and leaving after Communion is like telling God we do not have time for Him. Before and after Mass are excellent times for prayerful preparation and prayerful thanksgiving for the gift of the Eucharist. Do we really give God the appropriate amount of time or have we simply fulfilled an obligation?
