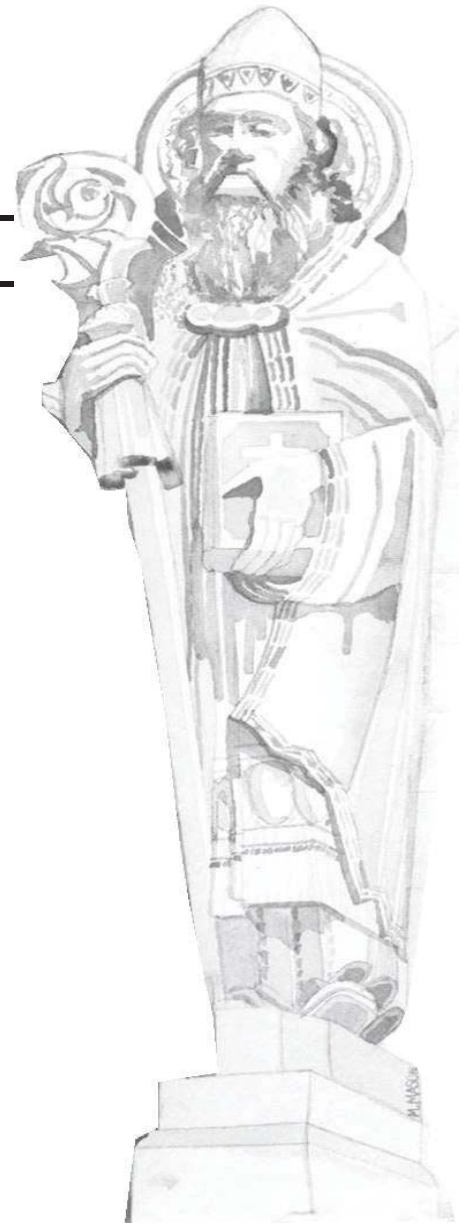

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The liturgy moves between earth and heaven. The gospel finds the apostles engaged in their highly symbolic occupation as fishermen and Peter is given the mandate to provide for Christ's flock. Proclaiming the gospel and pastoral care these two ideas are clearly linked to the liturgy. The preaching of the apostles is symbolic of the constant process of the church's effort to evangelize. Yet the church has no other choice but to proclaim. It is the sharing of a gift, our faith, that has been shared by men and women who have given their lives with unlimited generosity and dedication. In our age the planting of the seeds of faith and nurturing must continue. We never reach a plateau where growth in faith stops. Deepening our faith means moving beyond the pew with a willingness to stand with faith conviction in addressing the needs of the people, community and situations that surround us our liturgy calls us to revitalize the faith. We are all part of the apostolic mission.
