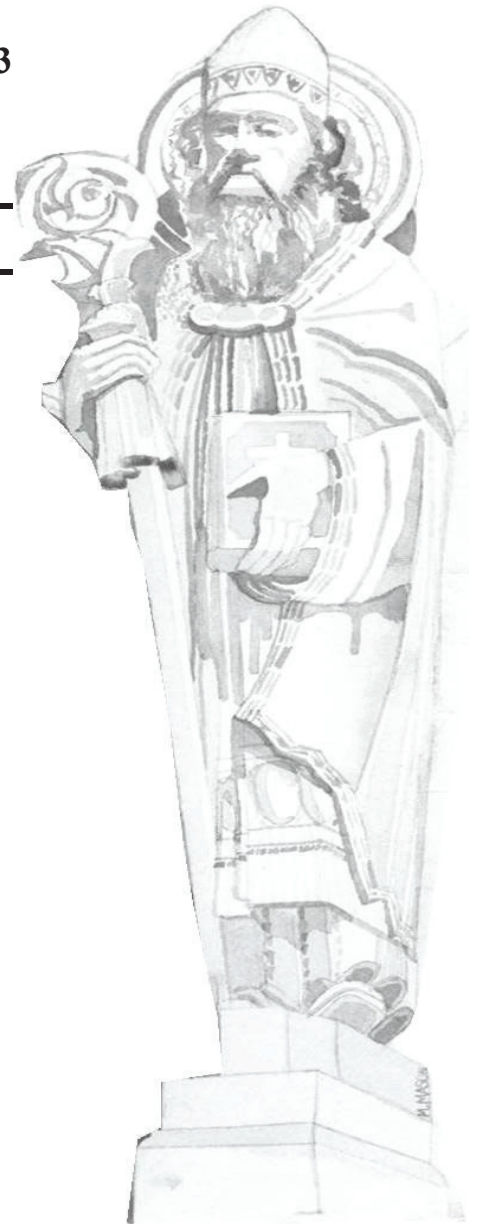

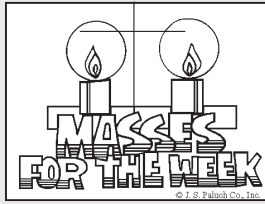
G.I.A. 75th Anniversary Gala Banquet & Concert Friday, May 5th
