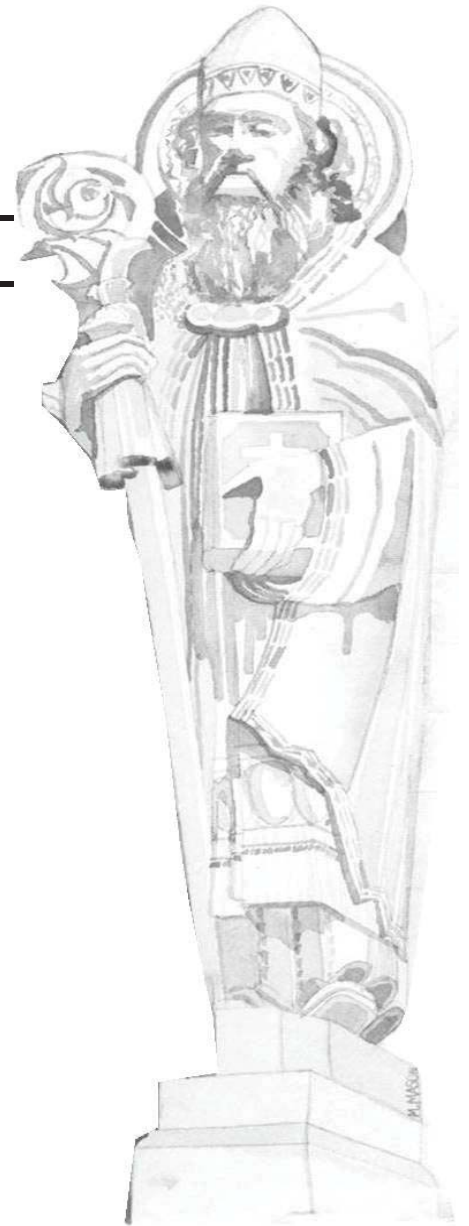

A Family Perspective



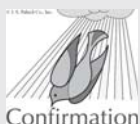
