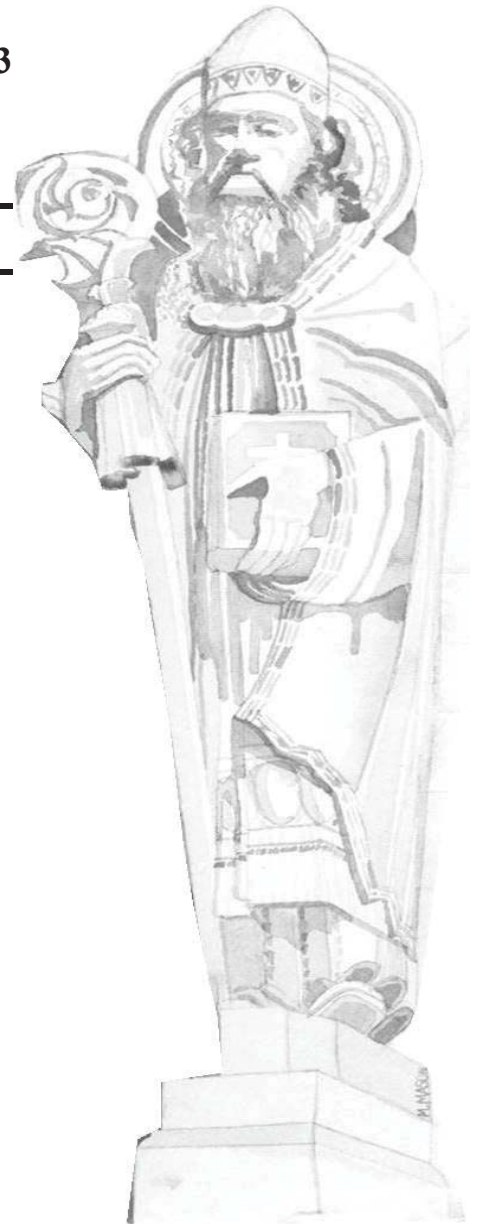

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The return of Christ at the end time is much to the fore in today's liturgy, clearly in Revelation and at least implicitly in Acts. The Christ who departed (our recent celebration of the Ascension) will return for the full inauguration of his reign. John's gospel is different. It places emphasis on the continuing presence of Christ in the believer and the church. Through the gift of the Spirit we are no longer strangers in God's household; we are now members of the family. The gospel speaks of our unity. Charity is the sign of our Christian life which expresses that unity. To live in Christ and to grow in faith is our challenge. The Spirit guides us in our journey. Our God is not solely coming on the clouds of heaven in the end time but a God who is never far from us. In fact, the Lord walks every step of the way with us.

Thoughts to Reflect on and Share: "Saint Stephen, the first Deacon and martyr, at the time of his death by stoning, cried out to God, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them'. If Stephen could be forgiving of those who killed him for his love of Christ, shouldn't we be able to forgive those who cast stones at us?" Deacon Herb

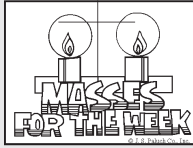

**LITTLE ROCK SCRIPTURE STUDY**

Little Rock Scripture Study - 10 week series on Exodus begins Monday, May 2nd in the small meeting room of the school cafeteria from 6:30-8:00pm with an introduction. Study set fee is \$15. The Exodus is the central event of the Old Testament. Its themes of liberation wilderness Passover covenant and God's dwelling are central for the whole Bible. It tells the story of God calling Moses to be the prophet through whom God will lead the people to freedom from slavery in Egypt and their struggles to learn faithfulness in the wilderness where God makes covenant with them. The 10 Commandments form the ethical core of this covenant while the instructions for building a tent of worship accentuate God's intention to dwell in the midst of the people.
