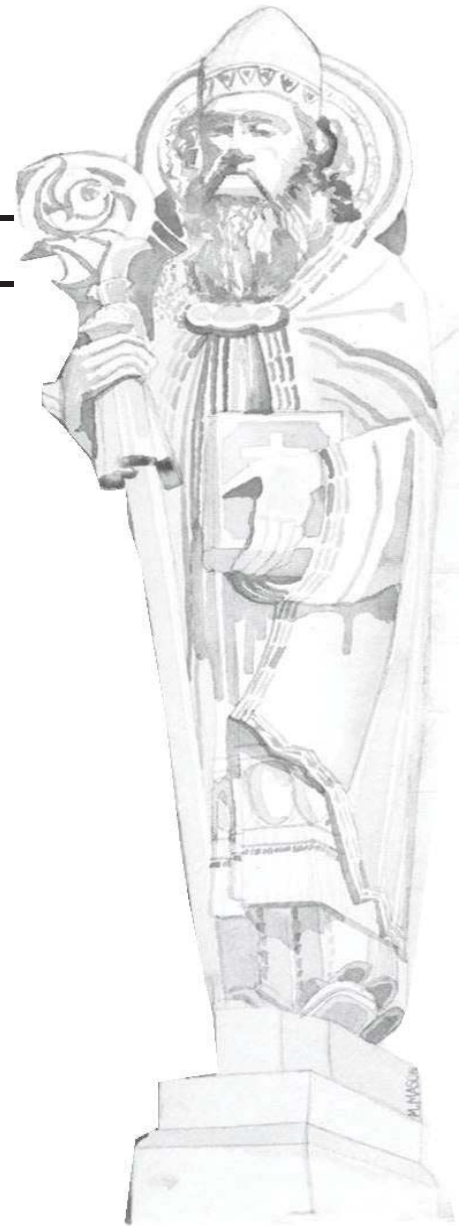

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

St. John reminds us in both the second reading and the Gospel passage of the primary characteristic of the Christian community: God’s love. When His love stirs within us, it causes us to reach out to others in service. To know God is to care for one another. Loving one another requires that we follow certain rules. The first rule is to always follow the Golden Rule...treat others as you would want to be treated (Mt. 7:12). What is it we like about other people? We like it when they don’t try to change us, when they accept us the way we are. We like to be around people who don’t take themselves too seriously and can laugh at themselves with a sense of humor. None of us likes being criticized or embarrassed publicly. As a matter of fact, anger and resentment often grow when others speak harshly to us. We want people to be tolerant of us even when we know we have annoying habits and mannerisms. It will be easier for people to love us unconditionally when we first model God’s love for them.
