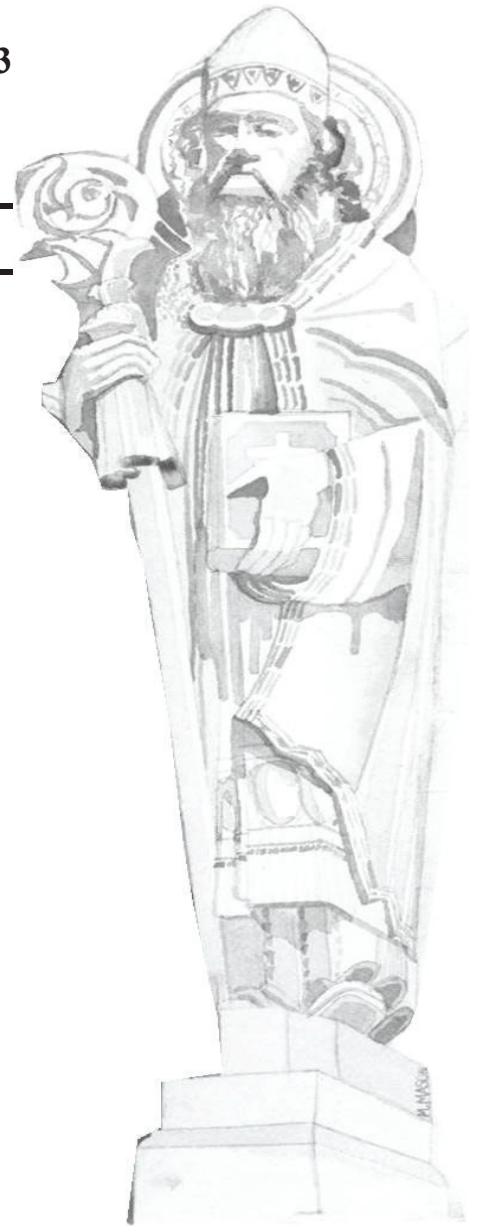

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Our reading from 1 Peter today describes the church as a spiritual building constructed of living stones with Jesus Christ as the cornerstone. Christ is the church's sole foundation because he alone is God's full revelation remaining forever in the gospel's words, our way, truth and life. In that spiritual edifice wherein we are all living stones, there are a variety of ministries, all contributing to the community's welfare. Our reading Acts today recounts the beginning of diverse forms of service in the church. The scriptures challenge us today to meet Christ in the faces of others and to be the living stones of service and love to each encounter.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: *"To be lost as a child is one of the most terrifying feelings in the world. To be lost and not know where we are going in our lives as adults should be just as frightening, as it was for Thomas when he said to the Lord, 'Master, we do not know where we are going, how can we know the way?' But Jesus takes away all of that fear when He says to Thomas, 'I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.' 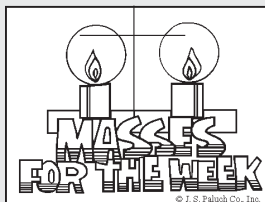
