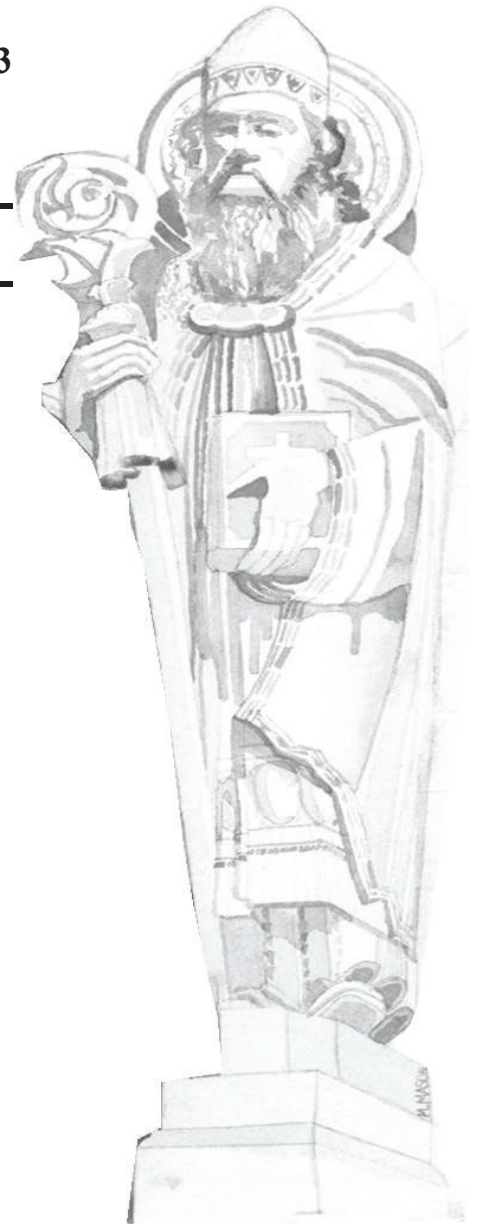

PENTECOST SUNDAY

The story of the first Christian Pentecost began in fear and ended in joy. Or, more accurately, Pentecost has not ended yet. For today, we live in the time of this powerful Spirit. On that first day, the disciples crowded together in an out-of-the-way room, unsure and fearful. It took an unmistakable manifestation of God’s power to shake off fear and replace it with bold proclamation. And so it came to pass. We are told in Acts that the descending Spirit came as a strong wind and rested over the disciples. The second reading tells us that the Spirit generates **harmony and unity** in the Church. No act of faith can be made, no good work accomplished, no ministry undertaken without the sustaining power of the Holy Spirit. All who are Church are one in the Spirit of unity. The people called to undertake this task and mission are called the Church-that’s us: Good Samaritans.


Thoughts to reflect on and share: *“Our fears, biases, prejudices and feelings of superiority can cause us to lash out in hurtful ways toward those whom we do not see eye to eye with. Rather than give in to these soul destroying emotions and risk our place in the Kingdom, we should strive to obtain and live out the fruits of the Holy Spirit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.* Deacon Herb **Follow Deacon Herb on FaceBook.**

Receive the Holy Spirit – After his resurrection from the dead Jesus appears to his anxious Apostles and, knowing their fear and uncertainty, pours forth the Holy Spirit upon them and bestows the gift of peace. For the next forty days he promises that he will be with them always and that he will send the Advocate to be with them as they will be called to continue his work in the world. Finally, after ascending to heaven, Jesus sends forth his Spirit at Pentecost to fill the Apostles with confidence and courage in order to go out to all the world to tell the good news and grow the Church. As the *On Mission for The Church Alive!* initiative continues to unfold we are called to prayer for a new Pentecost in the Church of Pittsburgh. This new outpouring of the Holy Spirit can bestow the peace we seek in the midst of change and planning for the future. God’s Spirit can also fill us with the confidence and courage that all of us – clergy and faithful alike – will need to do our part to build up the Church and make it ever more alive! Monday, October 15th - This day will mark the implementation of the new parish groupings and the beginning of the assignments

LITURGICAL REMINDER

During the recitation of the Profession of Faith at Mass at the words, "by the power of the Holy Spirit...became man," a bow of the head is the appropriate gesture. On the solemnities of the Annunciation of the Lord and Christmas all kneel for these words. Also, before receiving Communion, the communicant gives a bow of the head as a sign of reverence before the sacrament (both before the body of Christ and the blood of Christ.)

INVITE A FRIEND TO MASS

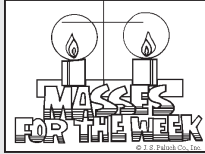
