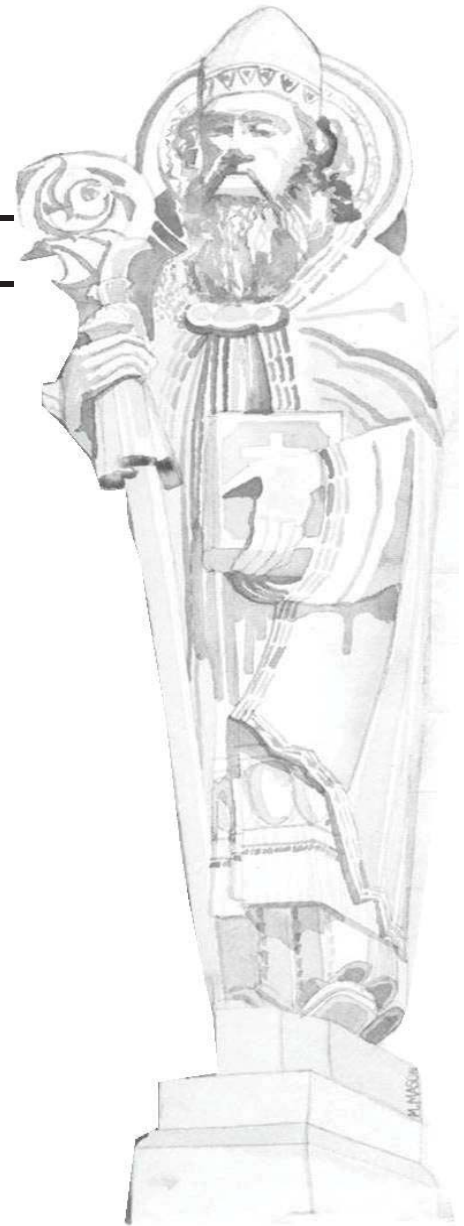

THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

In today's gospel, Jesus is portrayed engaging his disciples in a challenging conversation: "If you love me..." Having issued the challenge, he then explains the how and what behind the "if". If a disciple loves Jesus and professes that love with words, those words are to be translated into and supported by obedience to the commands he has given. The works of love are simple. A quick scan of the good news will suggest several: to love one another as Jesus loved, to lead through service, to serve others selflessly, to cherish all others as brothers and sisters of the same parent-God, to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to heal the sick, to welcome the stranger, to offer hospitality to those who cannot return the kindness, to forgive as we have been forgiven and to daily embrace the cross. To meet these challenges John reminds us today that the Spirit of Truth is always with us. The demands of love define for us particularly who we are as a faith community of St. Colman.
