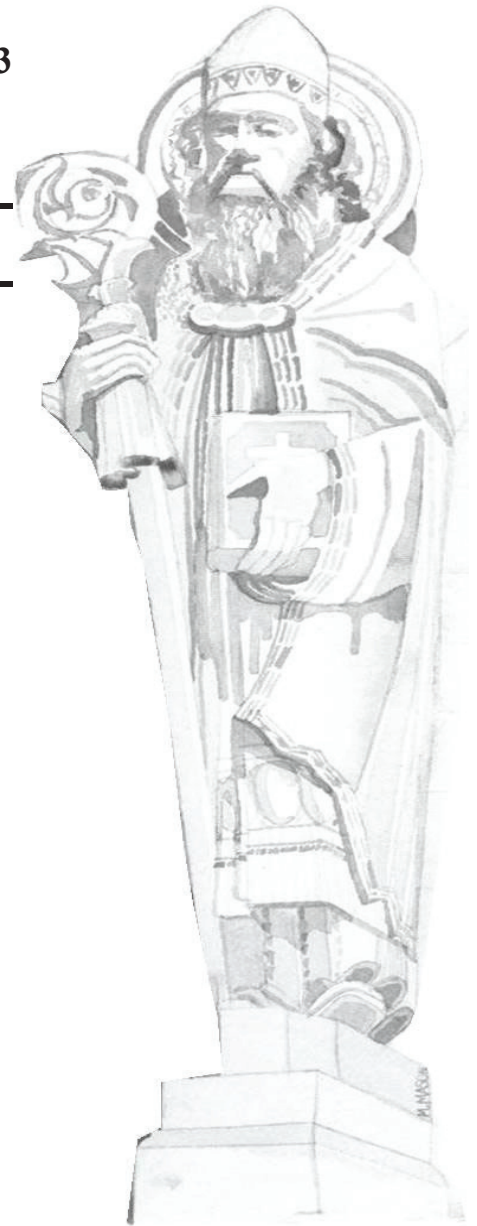

**TRINITY SUNDAY**

Christianity teaches us that salvation is a “group affair.” No one is saved because he or she has developed an intense personal relationship with God while ignoring the rest of the human community. In Christianity “to be saved” and “to be fully human” include the development of authentic relationships with other persons. It is mystically fitting that the God of the Christian Scriptures is not an “isolated individual.” Our God is a Trinity, a mysterious blend of Three Persons. The very nature of goodness, therefore implies “interpersonal relationships”, some sort of inner communication within the very substance of the divine. We can learn a lesson from the Trinity. Christianity demands that we support one another, depend on one another and love one another. Our God, the Creator, needs and supports the Redeemer and Sanctifier.

**LOOKING AHEAD - VERY IMPORTANT DATES FOR THIS YEAR:** Obviously, you will hear much more about this as the time draws nearer, but note these important dates for the Church Alive Process:

**Monday, October 15th** - This day will mark the implementation of the new parish groupings and the beginning of the assignments

**The History of the Catholic Church** - Thursday, June 14, 2018 at 7pm. A talk will be given by Shawn Whalen, a World Religion teacher at Gateway High School. This talk is a general history of how the Catholic Church was established in America. How did Catholicism come to America? Where is the Church in America? The future of the Church in America? **LITURGICAL REMINDER**

During the recitation of the Profession of Faith at Mass at the words, "by the power of the Holy Spirit...became man," a bow of the head is the appropriate gesture. On the solemnities of the Annunciation of the Lord and Christmas all kneel for these words. Also, before receiving Communion, the communicant gives a bow of the head as a sign of reverence before the sacrament (both before the body of Christ and the blood of Christ.)

**PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS**

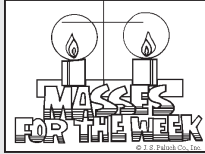
The presentation of the gifts (bread and wine) at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is an opportunity for the faithful to participate actively in the celebration of the Mass. The designated individuals represent the community in this service role. Seriously consider this ministry. Simply inform the usher before Mass of your intention. It would be appropriate for family members to perform this service as a group, especially if the intention of the Mass is for a loved one.
