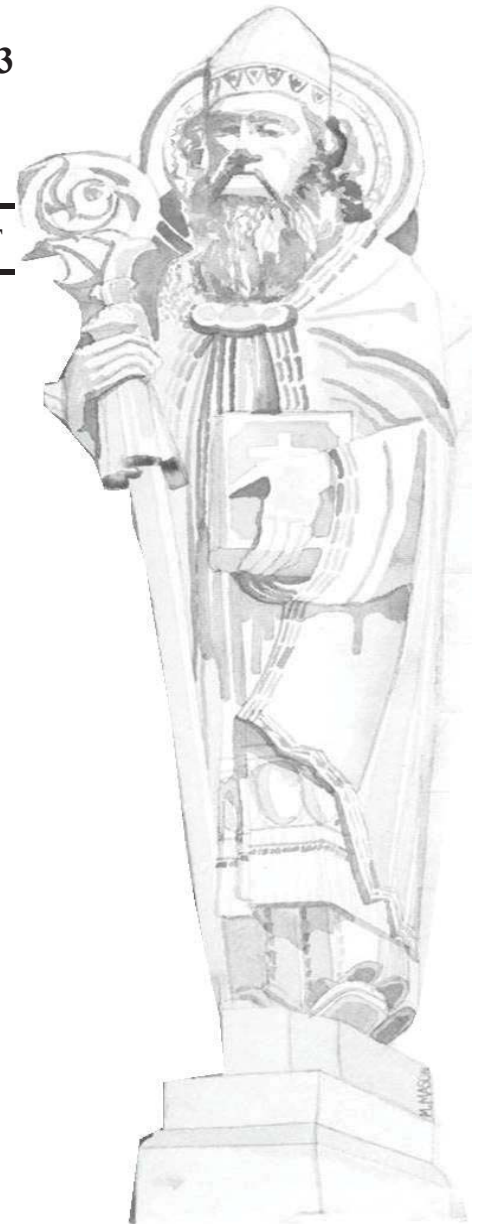

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today's feast reminds us of three transformations. The first is the mysterious changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Jesus chose the most ordinary and common things to be the way in which he comes to us as our source of nourishment. As Catholics we have been celebrating the Eucharist for two thousand years. The second occurs when we take that Body and Blood of Christ into our very selves. When, in faith, we receive the Eucharist, we open ourselves to the life-changing presence of Jesus. We as a community become united as nothing else could ever unite us. We are brought together in a union by the Lord himself. We become the Body of Christ. The third transformation happens through our union with Christ and with one another; we are sent to transform the world. We bring the transforming power of God's love to all those in need of such a wonderful gift.

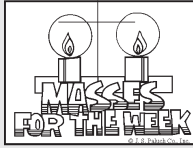
