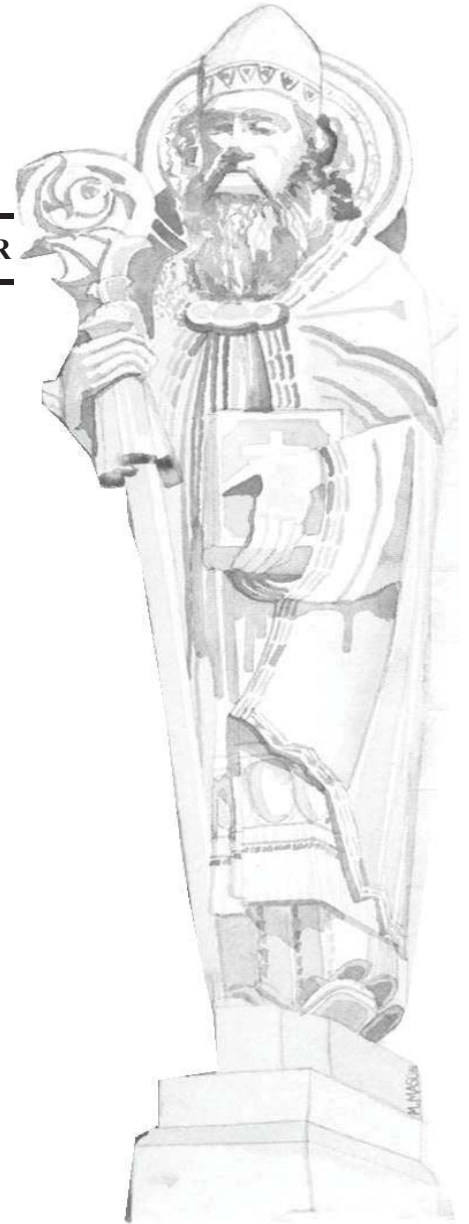

THE SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The occasion of prayer, recorded in today's gospel, is the moment when Jesus is telling his disciples that he will be leaving them shortly. He asks God to take care of them because he knows they will need it. They will never be able to perform their ministry alone. They will need to depend on the Creator. Christianity is not a religion of the self-sufficient person. It teaches a dependence on God who comes to us most often through our fellow human beings. When we depend on others, we enter deeply into their lives, we touch their experiences, we share without reservation. To recognize that one has to depend on God to face any crisis fully, to know that one needs other human beings in order to handle any situation completely, is to know at once that everything is beyond our capacity-without God and our neighbors-and that nothing is beyond our capacity-with God and our neighbors.
