

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST: CORPUS CHRISTI

The feast of Corpus Christi reminds us in a very concrete way of the extent to which the journey of faith is aided by the Lord's Eucharistic presence. What begins in First Communion continues until death with many sustaining pauses along the way wherein the Eucharist is repeatedly seen in faith as the road to eternal life. At each Mass we are dinner guests of the Lord. "Blessed are those who are called to His supper." Paul today reminds us of the social dimension of the Eucharist. The one bread is shared in Africa, Asia, North and South America. It is the one bread in which the lowly and exulted, the chief executive officer and the person on welfare, the powerful and the powerless partake together. And it makes brothers and sisters of us all. We all eat of the same bread. Within Christianity there is no first and second class dining rooms. If the Eucharist has any meaning for us, we must show the unity we share in our daily lives. Look once again at our mission statement on the cover of the bulletin. This must be our focus and vision no matter what changes we must make in the near future. Our spiritual life must be a priority over material attachments.
