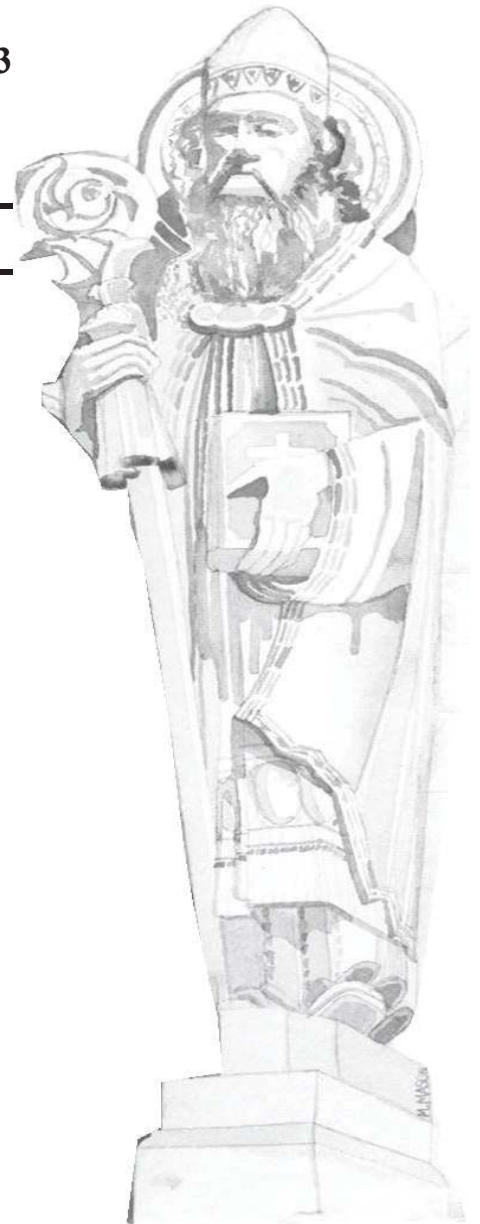

PENTECOST SUNDAY

The story of the first Christian Pentecost began in fear and ended in joy. Or, more accurately, Pentecost has not ended yet. For today, we live in the time of this powerful Spirit. On that first day, the disciples gathered together in an out-of-the-way room, unsure and fearful. It took an unmistakable manifestation of God’s power to shake off fear and replace it with bold proclamation. And so it came to pass. We are told in Acts that the descending Spirit came as a strong wind and rested over the disciples. The second reading tells us that the Spirit generates harmony and unity in the Church. 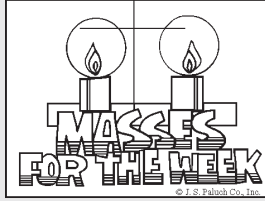

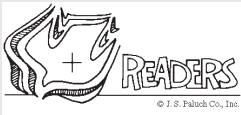
