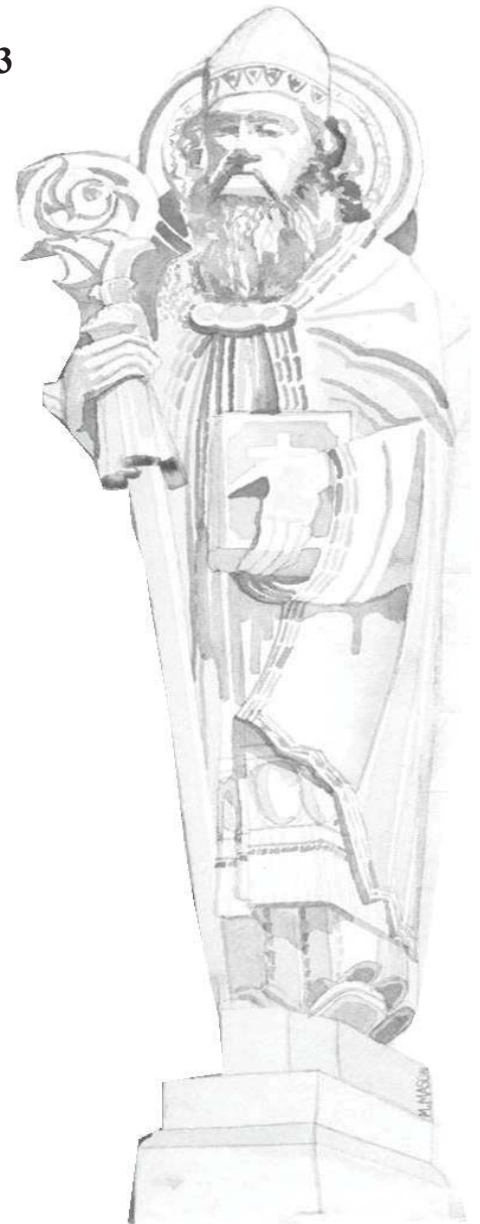

**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY
BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

Today's feast reminds us of three transformations. The first is the mysterious changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Jesus chose the most ordinary and common things to be the way in which he comes to us as our source of nourishment. As Catholics we have been celebrating the Eucharist for two thousand years. The second occurs when we take that Body and Blood of Christ into our very selves. When, in faith, we receive the Eucharist, we open ourselves to the life-changing presence of Jesus. We as a community become united as nothing else could ever unite us. We are brought together in a union by the Lord himself. We become the Body of Christ. The third transformation happens through our union with Christ and with one another; we are sent to transform the world. We being the transforming power of God's love to all those in need of such a wonderful gift.

Thoughts to Reflect on and Share: From Deacon Herb:

"When Jesus shared the Passover meal with His disciples, he didn't say this bread and this wine are symbols of me. He told them, 'take it; THIS IS MY BODY AND BLOOD'. REVERENCE IN OUR CELEBRATION
OF THE EUCHARIST**

BEING ON TIME - *Our time of arrival for Mass and when we leave Mass is an expression of our reverence. If Mass has simply become a routine or an obligation to be fulfilled, we will give it only a minimum amount of time. If we truly have a reverence and a respect for the Eucharist and are truly grateful to God, we will arrive on time, perhaps even a little early, and would remain there until the Mass has ended. Arriving just in time for the readings and leaving after communion is like telling God we do not have time for Him. Before and after Mass are excellent times for prayer and preparation and prayerful thanksgiving for the gift of the Eucharist. Do we really give God the appropriate amount of time or have we simply fulfilled an obligation?*
