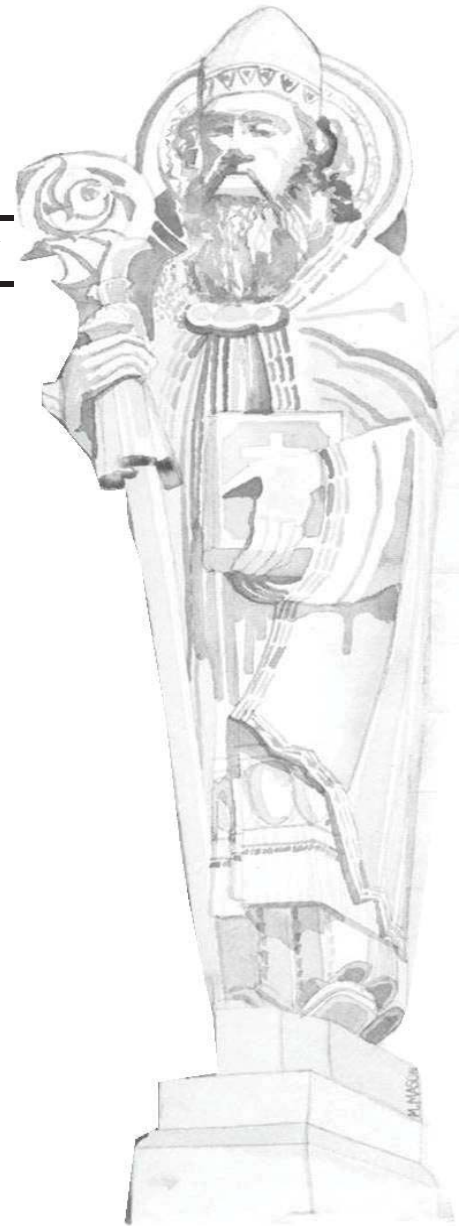

**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY**

*Christianity teaches us that salvation is a "group affair." No one is saved because he or she has developed an intense personal relationship with God while ignoring the rest of the human community. In Christianity "to be saved" and "to be fully human" include the development of authentic relationships with other persons. It is mystically fitting that the God of the Christian Scriptures is not an "isolated individual." Our God is a Trinity, a mysterious blend of three persons.
