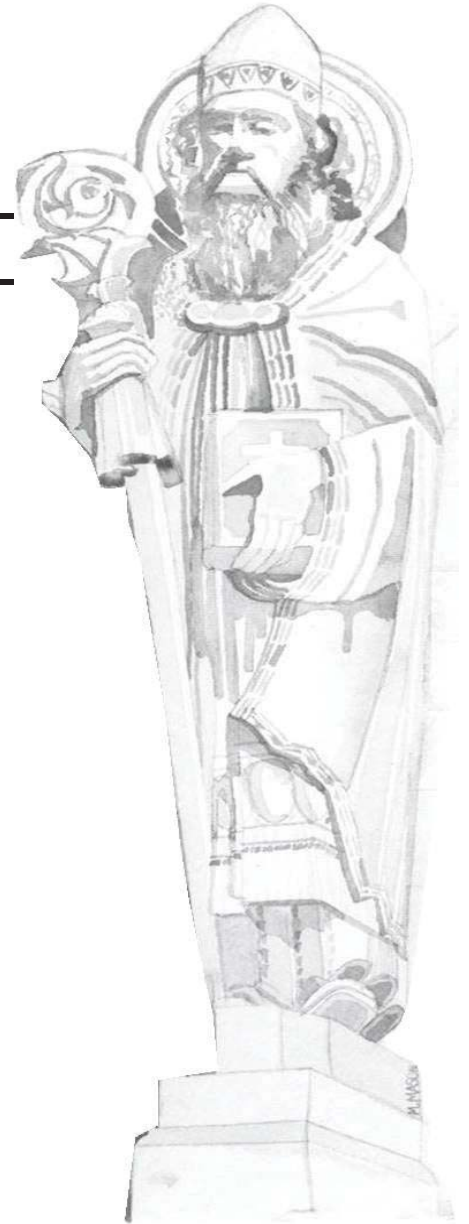

THE TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In the first reading the house of David and Jerusalem look upon an unknown sufferer as they grieve over the one they have pierced. Suffering is a central topic of the Gospel, as well as Jesus turns his disciples away from an exalted notion of Messiah to one suffering. It is a pain which they themselves will one day endure as well. Christ bore his cross in obedience to the Father for love of the world. It is interesting that the destiny of Jesus' followers encompasses the same fate. Cross bearing for Jesus involved many things, among them the hardships of his earthly ministry, yet he gave his all "for the sheep without a shepherd." In our lives we don't have to seek the cross. It will find us. Our response is important. Can we accept it in faith? Illness, poverty, financial loss, rejection, giving of ourselves for others-the cross is certain to come in one way or another. We pray for the grace to bear it with love. Cross bearing is woven into the fabric of discipleship but Jesus has shown us the way through each cross to life, resurrection and resolve.
