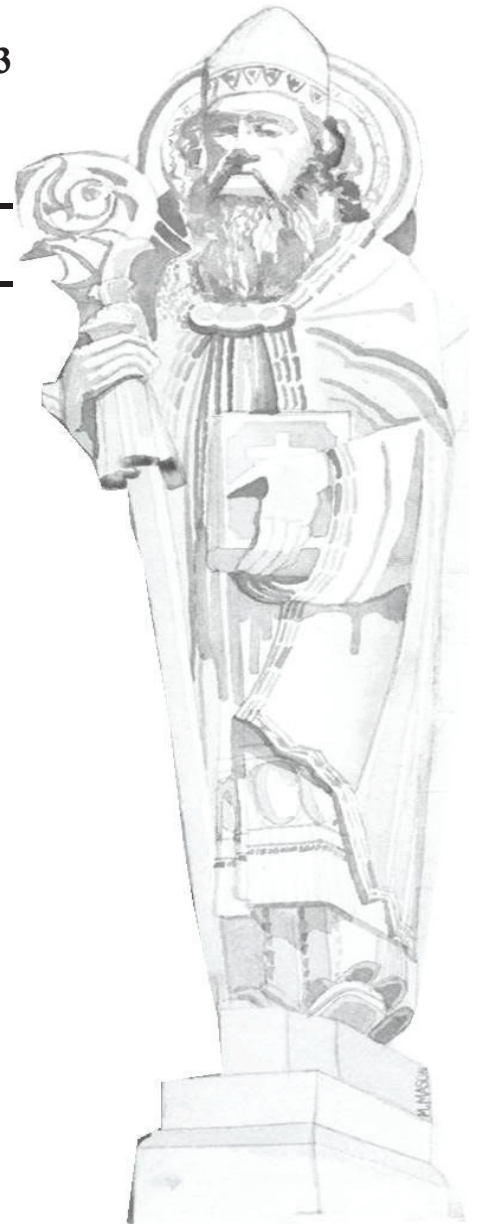

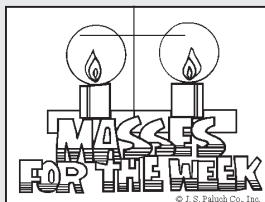
**Turtle Creek Smoke Alarm Detector
