

THE THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus set out to save people, not to win arguments. Today, his compassionate words and actions reveal the deepest truth of his life and of God's life, too. For God did not make death or desire the destruction of the living. The way of compassion so clearly explained in the Book of Wisdom is reflected in the generous companionship of Jesus as he walks with desperate Jairus and is approached by an equally desperate woman who pushes herself forward in such an unseemingly manner. Jesus does not stand on ceremony: he does not claim special privileges. He leans toward Jairus, toward the woman, toward the child. This is how he wins hearts. Paul in the second reading encourages the Corinthians to abound in charity and demonstrate compassion in their lives. Both Jesus and Paul challenge us today to reflect compassion and charity in our lives especially in the unexpected opportunities that come our way.

Thoughts to Reflect on and Share: From Deacon Herb:

"Jesus gave everything for us so that we will have all that we need. We too are called to give to meet the needs of others; not everything that we have like Christ, but from our abundance. Find someone in need and help them in whatever way you can." Follow Deacon Herb on Facebook.

LITURGICAL REMINDER

During the recitation of the Profession of Faith at Mass at the words, "by the power of the Holy Spirit...became Man," a bow of the head is the appropriate liturgical gesture. On the solemnities of the Annunciation of the Lord and Christmas, all kneel for these words. Also, before receiving Communion, the communicant gives a bow of the head as a sign of reverence before the sacrament (both before the body of Christ an before the blood of Christ).

PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS

The presentation of the gifts (bread and wine) at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is an opportunity for the faithful to participate actively in the celebration of the Mass. The designated individuals represent the community in this service role. Seriously consider this ministry. Simply inform the usher before Mass of your intention. It would be appropriate for family members to perform this service as a group, especially if the intention of the Mass is for a loved one..
