THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME


A self-indulgent society will not understand the message from the Gospel of Matthew. The words sound negative and devoid of happiness. To take up the cross and to bring oneself to naught are not attractive phrases. A society that depends on excess and instant gratification will never get to experience the fulfilling happiness that is tucked away inside self-discipline. Athletes, artists, composers and students quickly learn the merit of discipline in their efforts. But too many individuals try to make every aspect of life secure, insured in pleasure, devoid of risks, taking care of oneself first. “Losing one’s life” means opening it up to unknown possibilities through unselfish risks. It means willingness to spend long, hard hours of effort at valuable tasks. It means not giving up on our struggle to achieve our goals when the first obstacles appear. To live the Christian message requires discipline in our lives. But it is an effort that strengthens our vocation to love God and serve our neighbors with joyful enthusiasm.

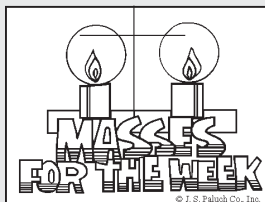
