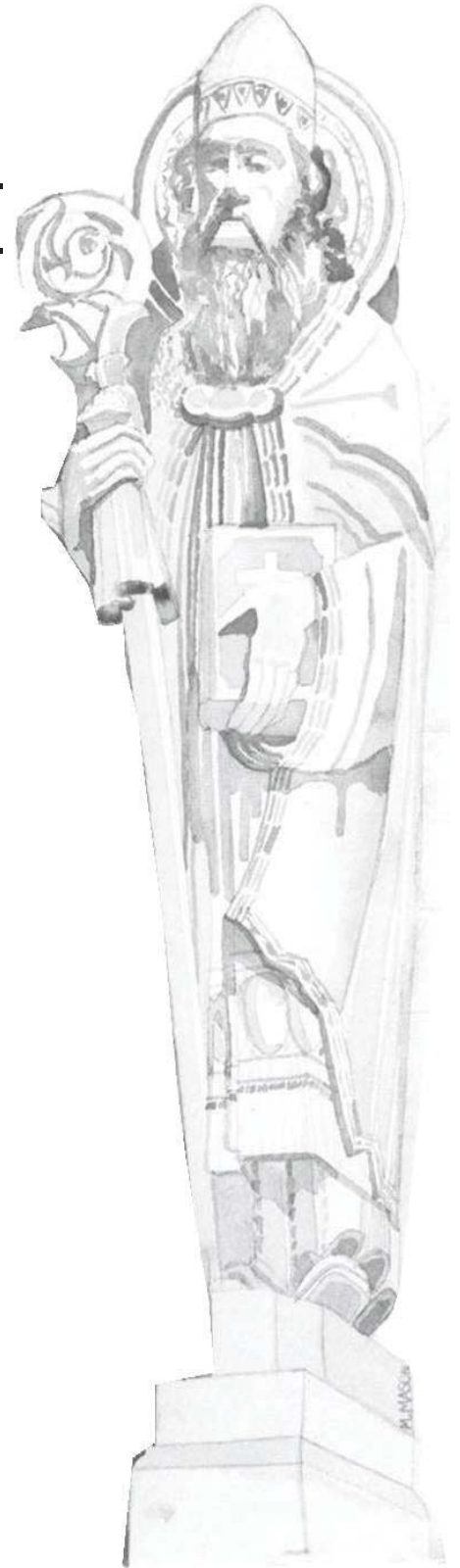

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR
