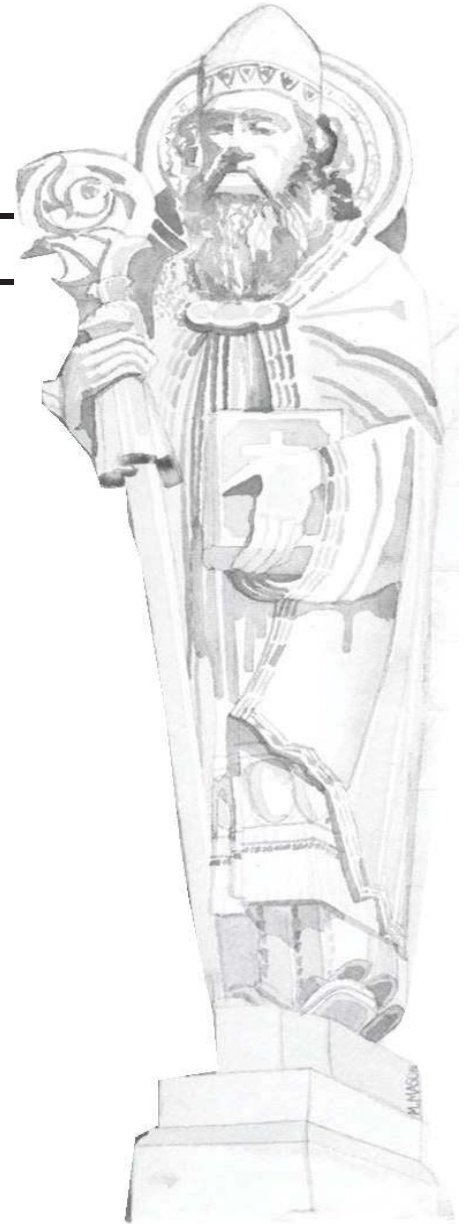

**THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

May we allow the Lord to mold our hearts into strong and merciful instruments of kindness and compassion.
