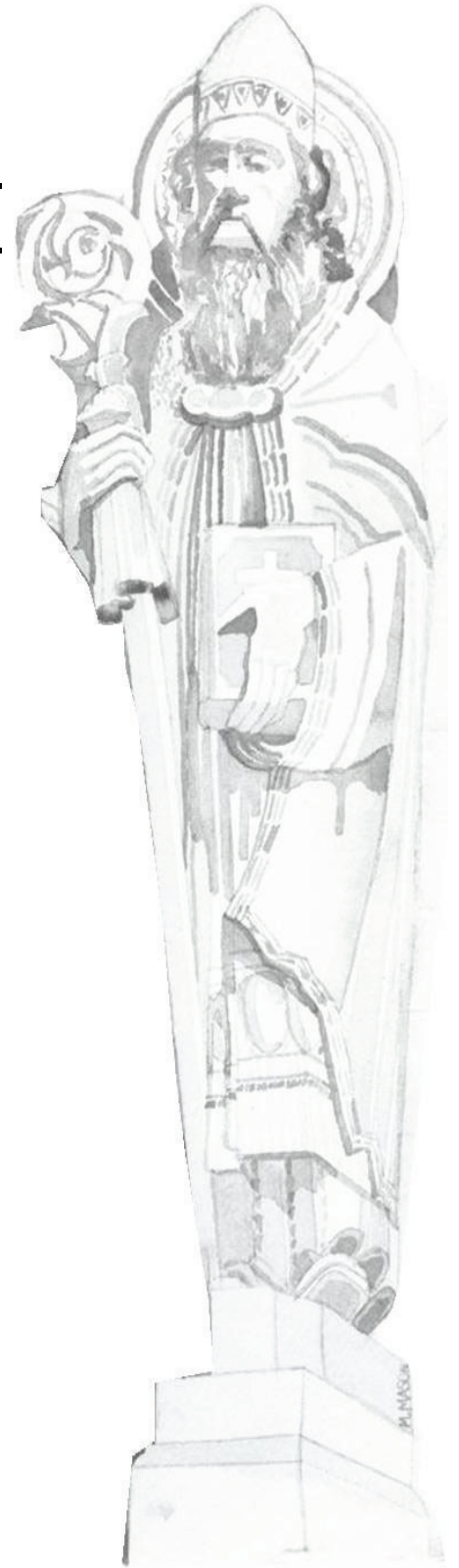

Pastor's Notes



SIXTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

All three readings today challenge us to be patient. That's a tall order for a culture immersed in satellite dishes, fax machines, mobile phones, the Internet and compact discs filled with volumes of information. Often we are in such a hurry that we don't take the time to look around us. Our hurry causes us to judge quickly. Patience, however, gives us the time to do God's work among the wheat and the weeds. Rather than judge the weeds as evil and lost causes, we are shown by God's example to wait patiently and lovingly for the final judgment which belongs to God alone. But while we wait for the harvest, we do not stand idly by. We need to see the work of God as our work. We need to temper justice with mercy. We need to show kindness and offer forgiveness. Any good harvest takes time and care to bear fruit. God gives us the grace to work miracles in the field.

WARMER WEATHER: With the warmer weather comes the desire to dress cooler for comfort. There is no problem with this approach to Sunday Mass but we must caution against getting too carried away. We can dress comfortably while still presenting our "Sunday Best." It is important to maintain a respectful attitude in behavior and dress when we celebrate prayerfully together in the liturgy.
