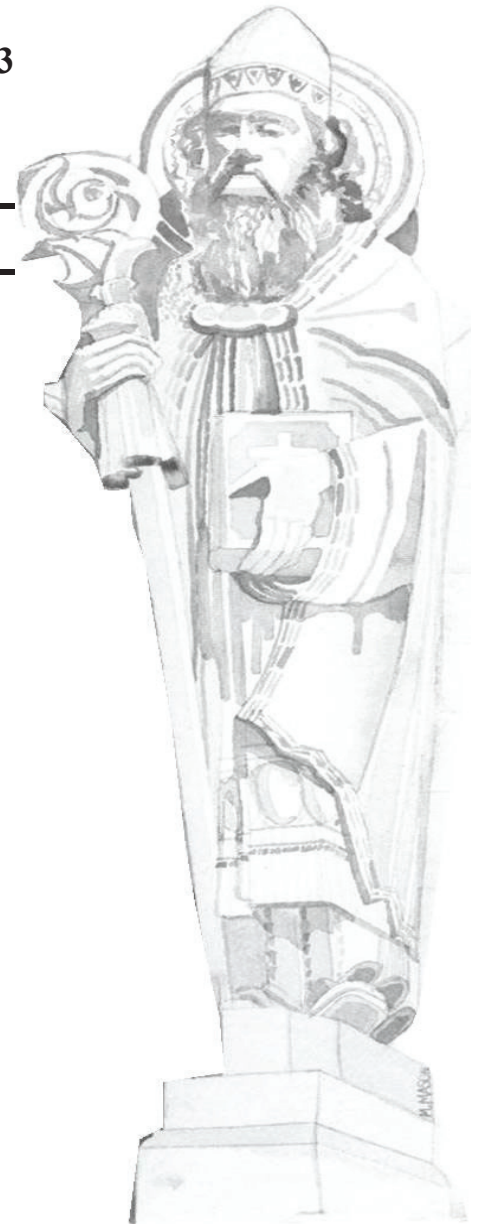

**THE SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Women play a prominent part in Luke's Gospel. Two women express the heart of discipleship: contemplation and service. God's word and ministry are coupled. **Don't let your child become a statistic!**

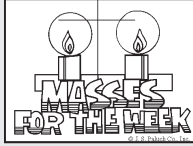
