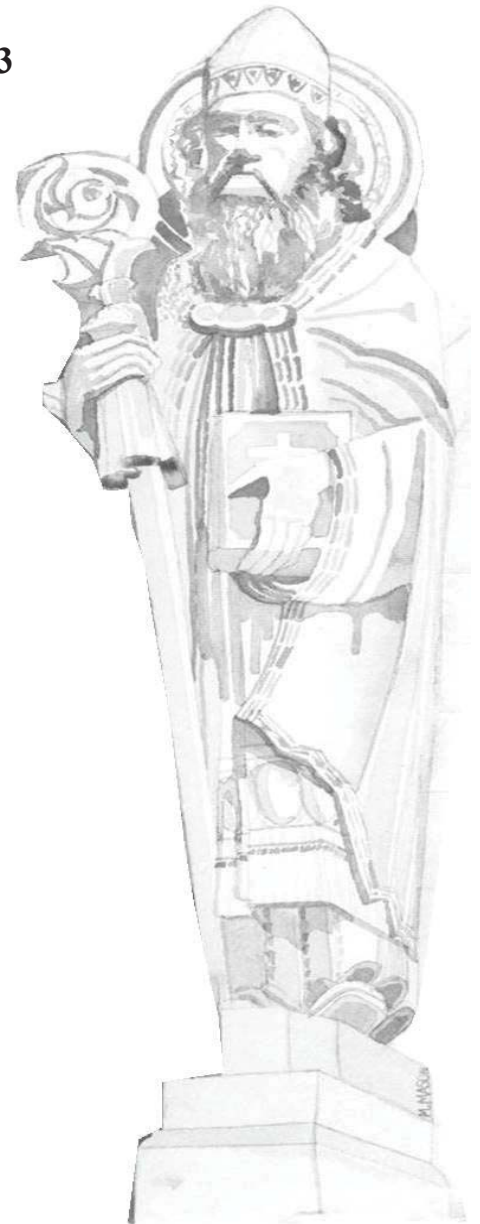

THE SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

What could be more appealing than the invitation of Jesus in the gospel “to come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while.” everyone in this complex American way of life feels that he or she needs “to get away from it all” on occasion. Here is a saying of Christ that is easy to follow. However, there is a danger if we interpret this passage to mean an escape from reality, a liberation from thoughts about of daily reality. Jesus does not mean an escaping. Rather He means a time we can stop and ponder our daily living so that we can discover what is really important. It means an opportunity to talk quietly and undistractedly with the divine being so that our priorities can be put in order. It means a time for a prayerful look into the very foundations of our being. Then when we come back from our thoughtful time we come back more real. “Pause and rest” Jesus tells us, but don’t escape. One of the great advantages of a reflective “pause that renews” may be the discovery that our daily reality really isn’t anywhere near as bad as we thought, especially if we recognized the presence of a caring God in our life.
