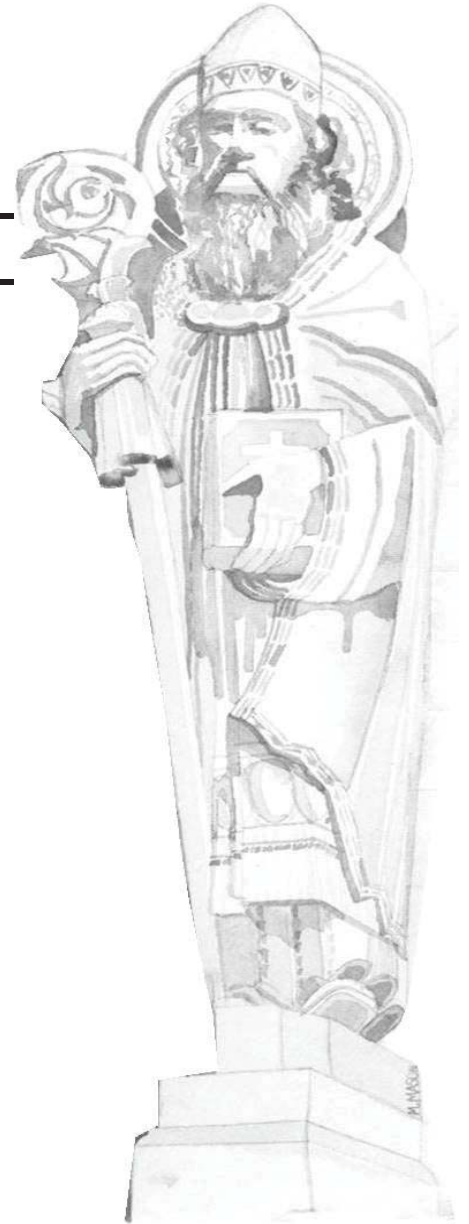

All three readings today challenge us to be patient. That's a tall order for a culture immersed in satellite dishes, fax machines, mobile phones, the internet and compact discs filled with volumes of information. Often we are in such a hurry that we don't take the time to look around us. Our hurry causes us to judge quickly. Patience, however, gives us the time to do God's work among the wheat and the weeds. Rather than judge the weeds as evil and lost causes, we are shown by God's example to wait patiently and lovingly for the final judgment which belongs to God alone. But while we wait for the harvest, we do not stand idly by. We need to see the work of God as our work. We need to temper justice with mercy. We need to show kindness and offer forgiveness. Any good harvest takes time and care to bear fruit. God gives us the grace to work miracles in the field.

REVERENCE IN OUR CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST**SILENCE IS NOT ONLY GOLDEN BUT SACRED**

Worship is the reverence and honor we offer God for being who He is and for what He has done for us. When we worship God, we use words, actions and gestures to express our love and devotion. This is especially true when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, which is our greatest act of public worship. Our reverence and behavior should reflect the importance of each celebration. In order to set a prayerful atmosphere, our silent preparation is essential. Quiet time is important to allow each individual to mentally prepare for the celebration. Therefore, it is our responsibility to maintain respectful silence once we enter the doors of the church. Complete cooperation is required. If important conversation is necessary, individuals should move outside the main body of the church to the entrance area. Let us attempt to observe this practice for our celebration here at St. Colman. Stay tuned for more good news about expressing reverence.
