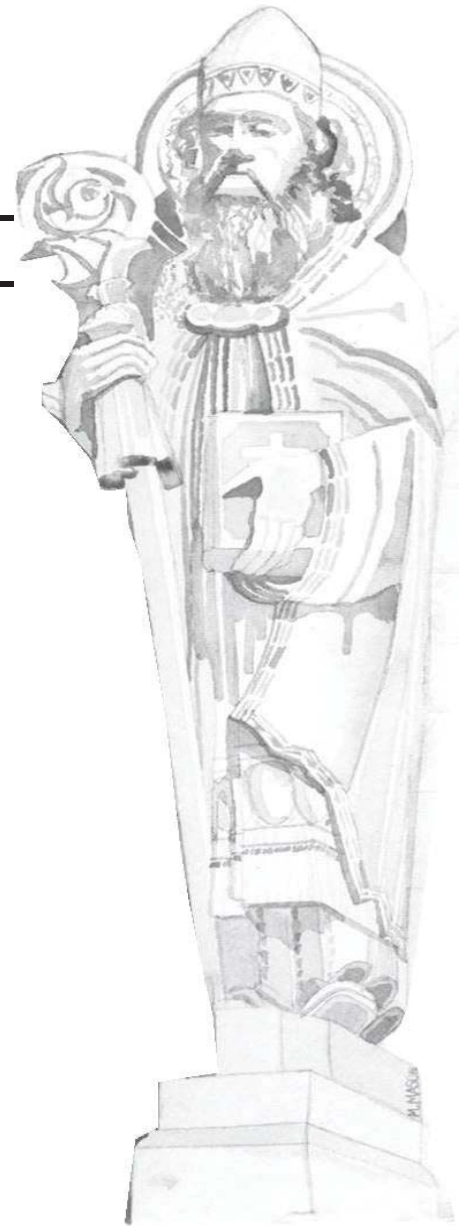

THE SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Women play a prominent part in Luke's Gospel. Two women express the heart of discipleship: contemplation and service. God's word and ministry are coupled. Our faith and awareness of God's presence flow into ministry, just as ministry becomes reflective when God is seen in human need. Today's gospel gives priority to reflection. It is only in an ever deepening awareness of "Christ in us" that our sense of mission remains strong. What is that reflection? I no longer live my own life but Christ lives in me. We are part of his saving work. We are never alone. Our joys and sorrows are shared. Our service may seem, at times, unproductive, even little appreciated but in faith we know it is not so. Now that summer is in full swing, we can take some time to relax and enjoy a few leisure activities, perhaps even travel a bit. But we don't take a vacation from Mass or prayer. On the contrary, the laid back days of summer gives us the opportunity to spend more time on our relationship with God.
