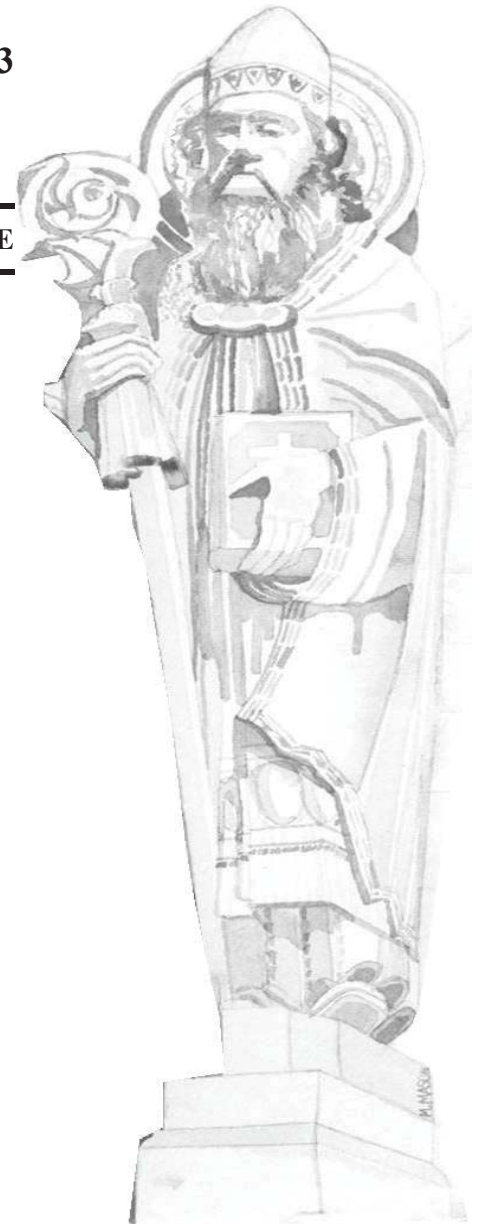

THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“Christian prayer is an openness setting the Christian free to receive God.” Through living in a prayerful way, we allow God into our lives. We open our whole existence to God who is present everywhere but is concealed. The prayerful person allows God into every aspect of his or her life. Prayer is not just saying prayers, but living prayerfully - - living in God’s presence.
