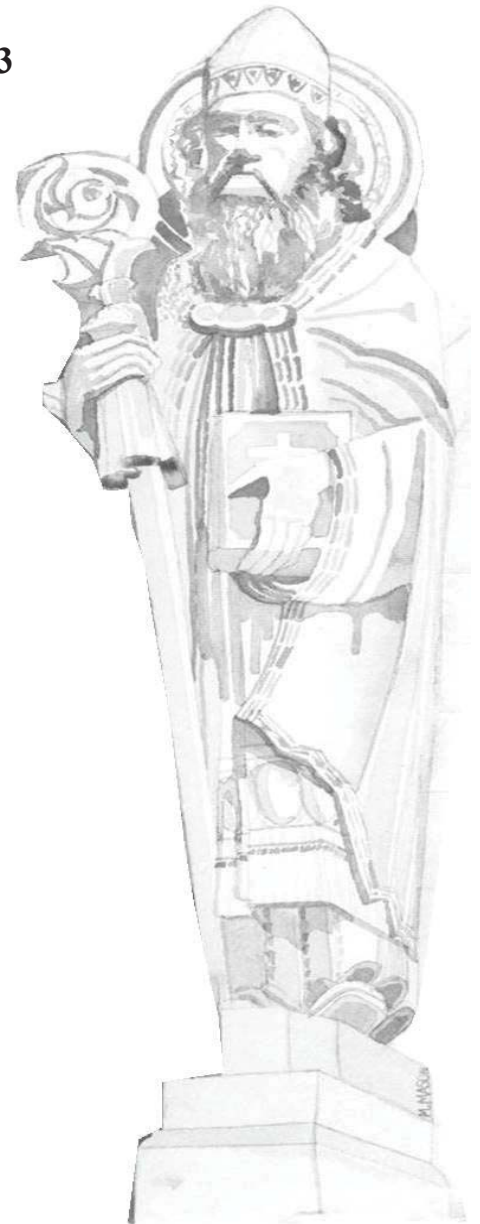

**THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

The crowds at Tiberias were fascinated with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. Many of them had originally been drawn to Jesus because of his miracles of healing and casting out demons. This miracle excited them. They wanted to make him king. But he fled to the mountain alone. The people were awe-struck; they wanted him for his power and the wrong reasons. But this scene in today's gospel offers a challenge. The miracle of the bread continues whenever we celebrate the Eucharist. It is the sign of God's response to our needs, His willingness to accompany us on the spiritual journey. It is our privilege to participate in this sacrament. With the food from heaven we can reflect the life of Jesus who gave us this gift. The Eucharist is central to our faith no matter where it is celebrated. Let us keep this awareness a priority.
