

# THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The crowds at Tiberas were fascinated with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish. Many of them had originally been drawn to Jesus because of His miracles of healing and casting out demons. This miracle excited them. They wanted to make Him king. But He fled to the mountain alone.
