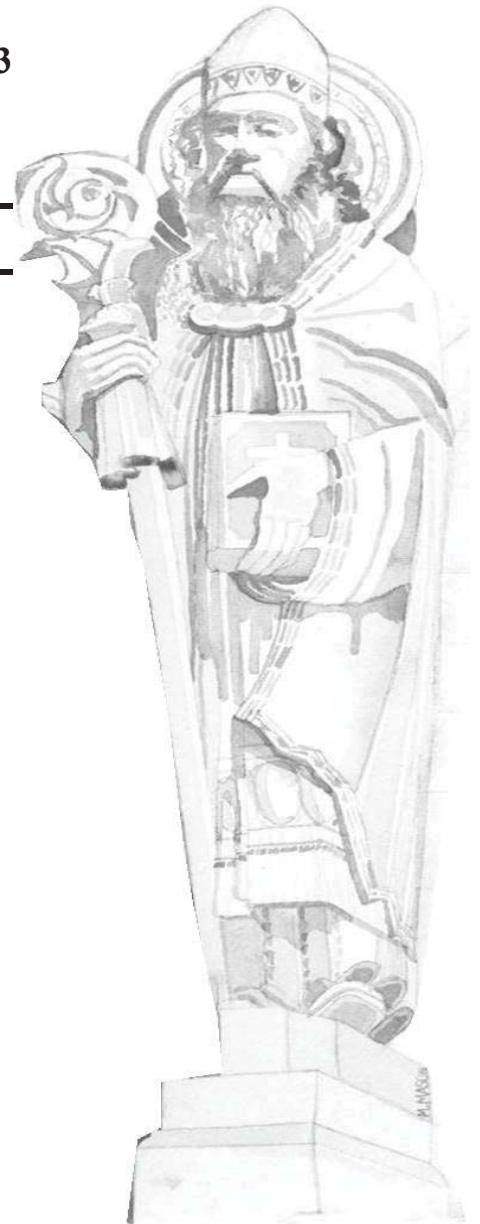

THE NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings seek to clarify the call of God in our lives and the response of faith. The Israelite people came to identify themselves as a people called forth by God, chosen to be his people among all nations. In the passage from Hebrews, we hear of a faith which is the core of Christian life, and attitude toward the whole of life. A Christian lives with confidence, with assurance, with conviction. In the gospel, we hear of the circumstances in which faith is lived, in the ordinary events of daily life. The kingdom of life and peace and justice is already in our midst. Yet, the responsibility to recognize it, to nurture its growth and to bring it to fulfillment rests on us all. Such an attitude of faith is the core of Christian living—the readiness to believe, the willingness to act with assurance, confidence, and conviction. God trusts that we can all be successful messengers.

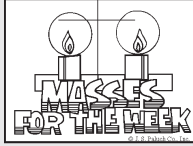
